PROVINCIAL LEGISLATURE.

FRIDAY, April 29.

At the afternoon session Hon. Mr. Warburton's motion carried and the House went into committee on the Sewerage Bill.

Hon. H. C. Macdonald pointed out that while the Water Commissioners, under the measure before the House, had the additional duties of Sewer Commissioners imposed upon them the qualification had been reduced so that a man who paid \$200 rental was eligible for the office. He thought the qualification under the new Act should at least be equal to that under the Waterworks Act. The bonds had also been reduced about 100 per cent. Under the Waterworks Act a bond of \$10,000 is required while under the present bill only \$5,000 is necessary notwithstanding the fact that the responsibilities of the office are to be very materially enlarged. He thought the bond should remain the same as at present, at least while the work was in progress. He failed to see the necessity of another election, as provided by the bill before the House, and expressed the opinion that the present Commissioners were well qualified to construct the sewers. Mr. Macdonald concluded his remarks by moving that after the word "that" in section 1 of the bill be struck out and the following inserted in lieu thereof:—

The Water Commissioners for the City of Charlottetown, as elected under "Charlottetown Water Works Act, 1888," and their successors in office, shall be a body corporate under the name of "The Commissioners of Sewers and Water Supply," and in addition to the powers vested in them as a body corporate under the foregoing act they shall have all the powers necessary to enable them to lay out, design, construct, maintain, and operate a system of sewerage hereinafter mentioned; and all buildings, pumping stations, tanks, particular sewers, underdrains, erections, attachments and appliances connected therewith, and to entirely manage and control the same and carry out all and every the powers and duties conferred on them by this act, and for that purpose to employ all engineers, surveyors, servants or workmen or every description required for the due performance of their said duties and also to make and enact and enforce all bye-laws and ordinances for the due carrying out of all the purposes and intentions of this Act.

Section 1 as it appears in the bill reads as follows:

1. That three persons shall be elected by the citizens of the said City of Charlottetown in manner hereinafter by this Act provided for, and that they and their successors shall be a body corporate under the name of "The Commissioners of Sewers and Water Supply," and shall have all the powers necessary to enable them to lay out, design, construct, maintain and operate a system of sewerage hereinafter mentioned, and all buildings, pumping stations, tanks, particular sewers, underdrains, erections, attachments and appliances connected therewith, and to entirely manage and control the same and carry out all and every the powers and duties conferred on them by this Act, and for that purpose to make and enact and enforce all bye-laws and ordinances for the due carrying out of all the purposes and intentions of this Act.

Hon. Mr. Warburton said the amendment was very sweeping in its character and he would like to consult with the Mayor and Councilors before taking action in regard to it. He suggested that the section stand over for the present.

Hon. Mr. Gordon spoke of the importance to the people of Charlottetown of the bill before the House. He thought that the people of the city were fully competent to decide who should represent them on the Board of Commissioners. He believed the time had gone by for measuring a man's ability by the length of his purse. He favored the section as it stood in the bill.

Hon. Mr. Macdonald said he was also opposed to the election of all the Commissioners at the one time. By this arrangement greenhorns might be elected each time.

Mr. Shaw agreed with the remarks of the Leader of the Opposition. He could not fall in with the idea that good men could not be obtained at the reduced qualification. He believed the present Commissioners were competent men, but the people should have an opportunity of saying who shall be members of the combined Board if the people wish the present Commissioners retained they may re-elect them.

Mr. Lefurgey thought that whatever Commissioners were elected should remain in office until the sewers were all completed.

Consideration of section 1 was then deferred for the purpose of consultation with the Mayor and Council. Section 2 was also stood over with the same object in view.

Section 3 was then taken up.

Mr. D. A. McKinnon thought that there should be three Sewerage Commissioners distinct from the Water Commissioners. These three would have their hands full.

Hon. Mr. Warburton thought that as the waterworks and sewerage were inseparably connected they should be managed by the one board.

Hon. H. C. Macdonald said that the duties of the Water Commissioners are not extensive at the present time. The present Commissioners are well qualified to construct the system of sewers. They are familiar with the entire system of waterworks and know where all the pipes are laid.

Section 3 was then put and carried, and before recess was taken at 6 o'clock several other sections passed.

At the evening session committee was resumed, and after passing several sections progress was reported.

Hon. Mr. Warburton moved the third reading of the bill incorporating the New London North Presbyterian Church. The motion carried and the bill passed.

House adjourned until Monday at 10 a. m.

THE STEAMER'S CHIMNEY.

Some Details of Interest Regarding Its Construction and Use.

The stroller along the wharfs who should see rising from the smokestack of a big steamer a small and perfectly defined column of smoke which seemed to come from a smoke-pipe within the big donkey wonder if the great smokestack was filled with smaller stacks, one for each boiler. As a matter of fact it is not so filled, but there is within it a smaller smoke pipe called the donkey stack, which is the chimney for the boiler of the donkey engine, which is used when the vessel is in port in hoisting cargo in and out. It is from this pipe that the small column of smoke is seen to issue.

The donkey stack is placed sometimes against the forward inner side of the big stack, sometimes against the after inner side. It may be a complete pipe, or it may be formed of iron in the shape of half a pipe, with flanges riveted to the main pipe.

If a single one of the large boilers were used, as it might be when the ship is in port, it might be connected with the donkey stack, but in their regular and common arrangement and use the uptakes of all these boilers run into the great chimney, whose whole interior is open, except for the braces running across it to strengthen and support it.

The chimneys of all large steamships, however, and of many other steam vessels as well are built double, with an inner and an outer shell, with a space between varying according to the size of the vessel. It may be from five to ten inches. The primary purpose of this chamber around the smokestack is to afford ventilation for the engine room and the stokehole. In at least one modern passenger ship ventilating pipes from the passenger quarters have been carried to these chambers. Incidentally the space between the shells helps to keep the stack slightly, for thus constructed the chimney is cooler on the outside than it would otherwise be, and so it holds paint the better.—New York Sun.
