# Navy Re-equips Carrier Squadron With Banshees

OTTAWA (CP) — The navy has just completed its program to re-equip its carrier-borne squadrons with jet fighters, it was learned Friday.

The navy bought 39 Banshee jets from the United States for \$27,500,000, the cost including lifetime spare parts for the planes.

One squadron normally is embarked on the aircraft carrier Bonaventure while the other is based at HMCS Shearwater, the naval air station across the harbor from Halifax.

Replacement of the piston-engine Sea Fury fighters by the Banshee jets began more than two years ago. The Banshees are being fitted with the Sidewinder, an American air-to-air guided

missile.

Meanwhile, a naval spokesman said, the half-way point has been reached in equipping the navy with the Tracker anti-submarine plane in place of the Second World War Aenger.

One hundred Trackers have been ordered from de Havilland Aircraft Company, Toronto, at a cost of \$116,000,000, including lifetime spare parts.

When 43 had been delivered a few months ago, production was stopped so that the Tracker could be fitted with improved anti-submarine equipment. Production soon will be started again at a rate of two or three a month. The Tracker program is scheduled to be completed by August, 1960.

The RCAF program to re-equip its two submarine-hunting squadrons at Greenwood, N.S., is nearly half completed, an air force spokesman said.

The RCAF has on order from Canadair Limited, Montreal, 33 Argus sub-hunters to replace the Neptune and Lancaster. This program is costing \$169,000,000, including engineering, development and tooling for Argus production.

Canadair is also producing eight CL-44 long-range transports for the RCAF at a cost of \$42,500,000 and 13 Cosmopolitan medium-range transports for \$10,000,000.

Two other planes are under development: the supersonic Arrow interceptor for the RCAF and the Caribou "flying truck" for the army.

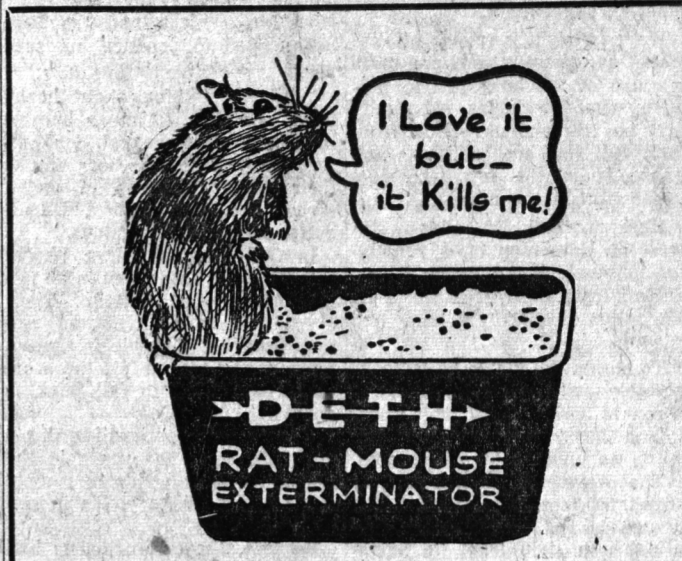

## Noted S'Side Veterinarian Dies At, 71

**SUMMERSIDE** — Dr. J. R. Cunningham, 71, of Summerside East died suddenly at his home here Friday morning.

He was up and around as usual in the morning and had gone out to the garden where he was found later by his son, William.

Born in Tatamagouche, N. S., Dr. Cunningham was a graduate of the Guelph Ont., Veterinary College in 1914.

He served overseas during World War I and attained the rank of major at the time of his discharge.

He then took a post graduate course in pathology at Edinburgh University. Returning to Canada he was employed by the Department of Agriculture in Ontario.

Dr. Cunningham came here in 1924. He set up his own laboratory, working in conjunction with the fox industry.

Until a year ago, he was in charge of the laboratory at Prince County Hospital.

He was a member of the Summerside Presbyterian Church.

He is survived by his wife, one son, William and three sisters: Mrs. Frank Dobson, Dorchester, N. B.; Mrs. Clark and Mrs. Johnson, both of Tatamagouche. A brother, James, lives in the U.S.

The funeral will be held from his late residence Sunday at 2 p.m.
