that section of the route. The Government had spent the winter, he said, finding a stone suitable for use as a riprap and had also been successful in locating suitable places for its use in crossing the river. He said the engineer employed to study the situation was a Federal Government man who was considered good enough for many big projects.

Premier Jones said that the roads here were not as bad as has been pictured by the leader of the Opposition. He also said that traffic at Wood Islands was far beyond the capacity of the ships in use. He thought possibly installation of radar, the use of two crews and an all-night operation might help. He also suggested the possibility of making the priority for trucks non-applicable in the afternoons.

The leader of the Government touched on many of the points raised by Mr. Bell last week, but dealt with them only briefly. In reference to the Federal-Provincial tax agreement he said that in previous years the governments here had had to deal only with hundreds of thousands of dollars but now it was a matter of millions. He agreed with Dr. W. J. P. MacMillan that the Province was not receiving enough but he thought Prince Edward Island was getting relatively more than any other Province. He also stated that other Provinces had more permit teachers than were here where there are 73. "Most of them are good teachers."

Fewer Delinquents

Speaking of the Opposition leader's remarks regarding lack of mention of Physical Fitness in the Speech from the Throne he said that last year the Province had spent \$213,000 on it. "But we did not spend that, we saved it," he remarked in reference to the value of the work in the prevention of juvenile delinquency. The Premier noted in passing that since Physical Fitness came into being there were few delinquents leaving the Province for confinement centres elsewhere.

The Premier said that he knew of three big projects in view for this Province, one in Summerside and two in Charlottetown. He did not elaborate on the statement and did not identify the projects. The statement came during a reference to defence contracts which "have not yet reached their peak, and when they do you will be surprised." His only remark
