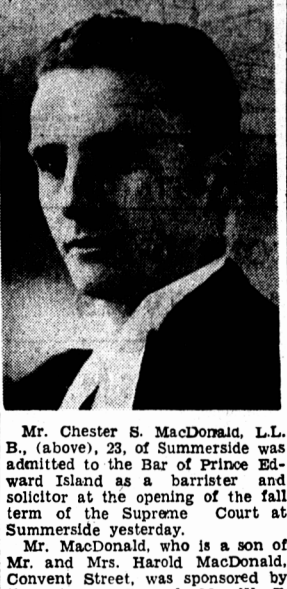

Mr. J. F. Connolly, Nov. 28—(CP)—A need for a trunk highway extending across New Brunswick and through the State of Maine in the "shortest line" route to Montreal was seen today by J. F. Connolly, of the Provincial Department of Reconstruction and Supply for Prince Edward Island.

Mr. Connolly was in Saint John attending the Maritime Provinces regional convention of the Community Planning Association of Canada.

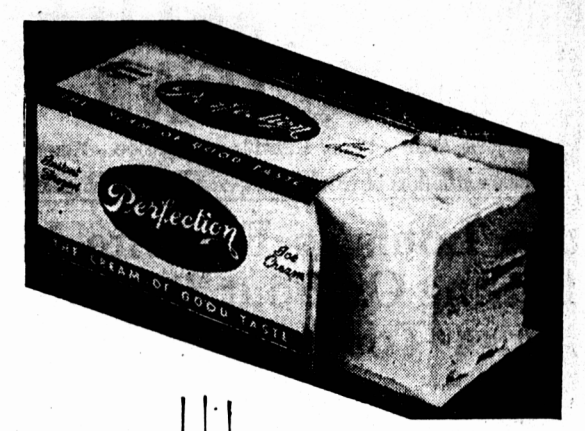
