The Transvaal War

GEN. KITCHENER AT WORK.

"And, at the end of the room, at a table which commands a view of all the rest of the room and all the other desks, sits a big dark, stern man with a heavy moustache, intent upon papers. Before he looks up I have time to note the telephones and neatness and orderliness of the arrangement of the table. When he does look up he keeps his fingers on the paper in front of him, marking the place where he left off.

"I begin to tell what I have to say. He looks at me with very keen, bright gray-blue eyes, and before I have said ten words he seems to know all the rest, including that which I had planned artfully to lead up to. In ten words he says what he has to say. He asks me about something which he wants to know, hears what I have to say, remarks that he is very busy, and before I have quite realized that I have shaken hands and said good morning, he is bending down again over his papers, deep in a calculation at the point where he left off.

"Lord Kitchener—for it is he—is engaged, they tell me, in reorganizing the transport system.

"Think of that—in time of war, in the midst of a campaign, he is doing for himself what the whole of Pall Mall would have bungled at for years in time of peace. But he thinks it is necessary, he knows that he can do it, and no one seems to have the slightest doubt that it will be a very advantageous thing to do. And I observe that of the men immediately around him many, down to the merest subordinates, are men whom he has trained and tried himself at the other end of Africa to know what he wants and to do what he wants.

"The head manager has brought his sub-managers along with him, just as Sir Thomas Lipton or Sir Westman Pearson or any other would do if he
