Secondly, you seem somewhat misinformed on CIMN policy. Top 40 music and artists are not "Repressed" as you seem to believe. The management policy asks for minimal airplay, but do not pursue it as dictators. Also requested is that if you play top 40 artists, to shy away from the popular song, and play one of the twelve other songs on the album, whereas A.M commercial stations are only allowed to play the one popular song, and no others. broadcast for the sole purpose of making money.
