

# 12 Months Of Crisis Weathered By India Since Death Of Nehru

**NEW DELHI (Reuters)**—India has weathered 12 months of crisis since the death of Jawaharlal Nehru, its first prime minister, a year ago today.

Food shortages and rising prices caused by the shortages have been the major problems for the government of India's 400,000,000 population.

While these have caused in recent weeks, the country has been swept by an almost unprecedented wave of anger and

a sense of humiliation over the clash with Pakistan about the Hindu of Kutch border area. The two countries also are in dispute over the state of Kashmir.

These storms have had to be faced by a tiny homespun man, Lal Bahadur Shastri, who succeeded Nehru as prime minister.

He started with the overwhelming goodwill of the country and now is completing his first year of office without any serious contender emerging—despite occasional criticism that he is indecisive and despite calls for stronger leadership.

## Island Doctor Describes TB World Problem

**FREDERICTON (CP)**—Dr. E.M. Found of Charlottetown, president of the Canadian Tuberculosis Association and director of tuberculosis control for Prince Edward Island, said here 3,000,000 persons die annually from tuberculosis.

Dr. Found, speaking at a luncheon gathering which preceded the annual meeting of the New Brunswick Tuberculosis Association here, said the disease is a "tremendous" public health problem.

"One-half of the world's population harbors tubercle bacilli," he said. "The treatment of tuberculosis victims is not enough. The disease must be attacked at source and on a global basis, with all the weapons at our disposal."

Dr. Found said there were 8,561 cases of the disease in Canada requiring treatment in 1963 and 756 deaths. In 1964, New Brunswick had 16 deaths and 932 cases requiring treatment.

Opening lead—king of spades. Here is an interesting hand from a duplicate tournament. At most tables the final contract was six diamonds, but not all the declarers were successful, several going down one when they failed to play the hand properly.

At those tables where South went down one, the play followed the same pattern all the way: West led the king of spades, which South took with the ace.

Declarer could not afford to play trumps right away, since
