Screen's Greatest Actress Lives Alone In New York

Greta Garbo, the screen's leading legend, turned 60 recently. Today she is almost a phantom, but after 25 years her films still are major attractions. The following story is the first of a three-part series describing Garbo's career and life.

HOLLYWOOD (AP) - She travels through a shadowy world of her own making, slipping in and out of airports, trenchcoated, with a slouch hat pulled down over one eye.

Sometimes an alert photographer spots her behind the dark glasses and steals a quick shot. She manages a smile, then races to a waiting limousine and vanishes.

Upon her arrival in Hollywood in 1926, she was immediately placed in the publicity mill at MGM. Press agents posed her with the studio's trademark lion. She was asked to don a spritzer's suit for a photograph with the University of Southern California track coach.

She snapped: "When I am being like Gish Lillian who was then the queen of MGM, no more publicity like this! no more handshakes with prizefighters."

ADVISED SILENCE - Garbo gave only a few interviews before withdrawing into silence. Lon Chaney told her: "Don't talk to anyone; we are in the business of illusion."

The illusion of the "divina" Garbo continued to grow during her 15 years in Hollywood and it remains vivid today. Friends say she is acutely conscious of that illusion and the way it is perpetuated by her 24 films, which can be seen on television and at Garbo festivals in arthouse theatres.

Over the years many producers have announced plans to return Garbo to the screen, and she has not discouraged their overtures. Recently Rosa Hunter sent her the script of The Heaven Train, in which she wanted her to play a nun. She returned it with the message that she didn't think she could portray a religious figure.

"I don't think she will ever act again," concluded the producer.

Garbo's friends agree. Says one: "If Greta went back to work now, she would be competing with the way she appeared in the films of her heyday. She looks marvellous today, but still she is 60."

Russia May Send Opera To Expo 67

MONTREAL (CP) - The Soviet government has expressed willingness to send the Bolshoi Opera to the world festival in Montreal, an Expo 67 spokesman said here.

Final negotiations for the Montreal appearance already have begun between Expo 67 officials and representatives of the Soviet ministry of culture.

It will be the Bolshoi Opera's first appearance in North America and only its second outside the Soviet Union.

The full company of 400, including the orchestra and dancers of the Bolshoi Theatre, would be sent to Montreal to present several productions in the 3,000-seat Salle Wilfrid Pelletier at Place des Arts during August.

Exact dates of the company's engagement, and details of repertoire will be announced at a later date.

Eight major opera companies now are scheduled to appear at Expo 67. They include the Royal Opera from Stockholm, the Hamburg State Opera, the Montreal Symphony Orchestra's Opera, the Vienna State Opera, the English Opera Group, La Scala of Milan and the Canadian Opera Company.
