N. Y. Stocks

NEW YORK (AP)—Prices in the stock market bounced up Tuesday in a recovery from the hard pounding they took Monday.

Gains ran through the entire market and went to around 6 points at the best with many leading issues up 2 to 4 points. Monday's losses went to 6 points repeatedly in key areas.

The Association Pres average of 60 stocks advanced \$1.30 as compared with a loss of \$3.50 suffered Monday. The average now stands at \$150.00. Trading came to 3,000,000 shares.

Here are some aircraft gains: Glenn Martin up 2, Boeing 2-7-8, Douglas 3-8, United 3-4, Northrop 2-1-8 and General Dynamics which makes both planes and atomic submarines up 4 3/4 at 80 3/4. Among other gainers were U. S. Steel up 1-7/8, Bethlehem Steel 1-1/4, Chrysler 1-3/8, Radio 3-8, American Telephone 3-4, Western Union 2, Anaconda Copper 1-1/4, Du Pont 1-4, New York Central 5-8, Southern Pacific 1-1/8, Rock Island 1, Sinclair Oil 1-8, Texas Pacific and Oil 4-7/8, Johns-Manville 3-1/8, Excelsior 2-7/8, Hercules Powder 2-1/2, Kaiser Aluminum 2, Mid-Continent Petroleum 2 and Missouri Pacific 2. Sunray Oil topped the most active list for the third straight day up 1-2 at 26 1/4.

Among losing stocks were Good-year off 7-8, Sears Roebuck 1, Houston Oil 2 3/4, and U. S. Gypsum 1-3/4.

Among Canadian stocks, Canadian Pacific gained 3-8, International Nickel was up 1-2 and Dome Mines advanced 1-4 McIntyre lost 1-2.

On the American stock exchange Royalite Oil gained 1-4.
