### Mayors Hear Report From McGill Expert

MONTREAL, June 11 — (CP) — Solution of municipal financial problems is a job for municipalities and not for Provincial and Federal Governments, members of the Canadian Federation of Mayors and Municipalities were told in a report released today.

The report was prepared for the Federation by D. C. Corbett, lecturer in public administration at McGill University. It will be discussed at the Federation's annual conference in Calgary June 29-July 3.

The report said that turning over responsibility for certain functions to the Province or Dominion means increased centralization with all that it implies.

Value of Local Government  
"The value of local government is in its ability to know and adapt itself to local needs and desires and in the experience it gives the citizens in running their own affairs under democratic rule."

"The fewer important functions local governments have to perform, the less vital will local democracy be, and the more apathetic will be its electorate and representatives."

Expenditures Increase  
The report said municipal expenditures tend to increase at a greater rate than growth of the municipality itself. This is not the result of extravagance but arises from the more complex and expensive services required than in less populated areas.

### Premier Douglas Rolls Back With Larger Majority

REGINA, June 11 — (CP) — The C. C. F. Government of Saskatchewan thrust into its third term today in the province's general election.

Premier T. C. Douglas was leading his party strongly to victory in early returns from the balloting tonight, and at 7:24 p.m. MST (10:24 p.m. EDT) — one hour and 24 minutes after the close of polling — the Canadian Press trend analysis indicated the government's re-election by an increased majority.

At dissolution, the C.C.F. had 31 members in the 52-member house, against 19 Liberals and two independents.

Other parties appeared nowhere in the running as the count progressed. Candidates of the Social Credit group — which ran 24 — and of the Progressive Conservatives — which ran eight — were trailing either C.C.F. or Liberal members.

After a survey following torrential rain last week-end, Harold L. Day, manager of the New Brunswick Potato Marketing Board, said that wet fields threatened a reduced acreage this year. Unlike the case of Maine, however, there was comparatively small occurrence of washed-out seed in New Brunswick, although rain has prevented or delayed completion of planting. Before the rain, more than 41,000 acres had been slated for cultivation in this province.

By last week-end, only 60 per cent of Aroostook County's seed was in the ground. As estimated 130,000 acres had been scheduled for planting in the Maine County this year.
