London, March 12.—President Thiers and all members of Government expected at Paris tomorrow. The Rodo propose formation of new republic with Victor Hugo as President.

London, 15.—Napoleon is known to have written Emperor William for permission to leave on a visit to Chislehurst. Believed that he received an affirmative reply.
