SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON

SECOND QUARTER. WORDS AND WORKS OF JESUS AS RECORDED IN THE GOSPELS.

LESSON VII.—MAY 13. A FIERCE DEMONIAIC HEALED. Mark 5: 1-20. Memorize verse 15.

GOLDEN TEXT. Go home to thy friends, and tell them how great things the Lord hath done for thee.—Mark 5: 19.

Time.—Probably toward the close of A. D. 28. Places.—1. On the eastern side of Sea of Galilee, the country of the Gerasenes. 2. The region of Decapolis.

INTRODUCTION.

The proper noun Gerasenes, which is the more correct reading of verse 1 (Comp. Revised Version) comes from Gersa or Kersa, the name still given to a heap of ruins once a city on the east side and almost halfway down from the north-east extremity of the Sea of Galilee. The site is surrounded by ancient tombs and about a mile to the south-west, on the shore of the lake, is a steep slope leading almost abruptly from the high tableland to the water's edge. On the shore of the lake at the foot of this slope are found the ruins of several buildings, to which are given the same name. This, in all probability, was the location of our lesson narrative. The proper noun Gadaranes, found in some ancient manuscripts and in the best manuscripts in the parallel account of Matthew, comes from Gadar, a city six miles south-east of the Sea of Galilee and south of the Hieromax or Yarmuk gorge. Gadara was a fortified city of great importance in ancient times, and may possibly have given its name to a province extending northward along the eastern shore of Galilee. One of the principal cities of Decapolis (v. 20), it was much better known than was the town of Gersa above mentioned, especially in later times and by people outside of Palestine. For this reason and because of the similarity of the two names, the latter may easily have been substituted for the former in copying early manuscripts of our gospels.

EXPLANATION.

- 1. "Over unto..." the country of the Gerasenes.—Compare Introduction above. 2. "Ship immediately"—With an ancient ship—possessed with a demon the symptoms mentioned in the next verses are those of a person whom we would call a raving maniac. 3. "Among the tombs"—Caves in the hillsides and limestone cliffs. 4. "But... afar off"—worshipped him.—The Greek word denotes simply an act of reverence, whether paid to a creature or to the Creator. 5. "What have I to do with thee?"—Literally, "What is there between you and thee?" What have we in common? 6. "My name is Legion"—With the Roman legion—an army division—the poor unfortunate was doubtless familiar. To him, as to all the Jews, it signified oppression, and was a sign of terror. 7. "Out of the country"—"Into the abyss" (Luke); that is, the abyss of Hades. 8. "And when he was come into the ship"—That is, when he was in the act of stepping into the boat. "Fruited him that he might be with him"—His deep spirit of gratitude prompted him to desire to be near his benefactor; possibly also the fear of the many demons from which he had just been delivered strengthened this desire. 9. "Howbeit Jesus suffered him not... and tell them"—Often on similar occasions Jesus had explicitly enjoined silence on the part of the person cured. (Comp. Matt. 8: 4; Luke 8: 55.) 10. "Decapolis"—A group of ten cities south and east of the Sea of Galilee.

QUESTIONS ON THE LESSON.

Has demoniac possession such as is here described any parallel in our day? What makes it difficult to determine the answer to the preceding question? Why did not the inhabitants of this vicinity want Jesus to remain after working this miracle? Why did Jesus in this case command the man whom he had healed to testify for him when in similar cases he commanded a silence? How was Jesus received on the occasion of his second visit to this region? What events intervened between this lesson and the next?
