Record Snow Fall Reported At S'side Since Last Fall

A record 147.5 inches of snow has fallen on the Summerside area since last fall, shattering a previous record of 142.8 inches last year, according to statistics compiled by the Meteorological Section at R.C.A.F. Station Summerside. They also report the heaviest snowfall for the month of May since the Meteorological unit was established at the base in 1942 of 6.5 inches, the previous high for May being 2.4 inches.

Diefenbaker Visits Truro

TRURO, N.S. (CP) — A horn-toting cavalcade moved the Progressive Conservative election campaign of John Diefenbaker into this central Nova Scotia town Wednesday.
Despite chill weather which brought snow to the area Tuesday night, the 61-year-old party leader switched to an open convertible on the outskirts, headed a 16-car procession through Truro streets at noon.
Riding with him was the party candidate for Colchester - Hans, Cyril Kennedy, who rose from private to major in the Second World War with the North Nova Scotia Highlanders and lost his right arm in Italy. He managed last fall's election campaign for Premier Stanfield in the premier's home area here.
Mr. Diefenbaker planned no public activities here until an evening election meeting. Today he ends his three-day visit to the province with a speech at Amherst before moving into New Brunswick for two days.

Sail Monday For Bermuda Tatro

HALIFAX (CP) — Naval and army units will sail from Nova Scotia Monday to take part in this year's Bermuda military tattoo from May 18 to 26.
The Canadians, going at the invitation of Bermuda's governor, include a 24-man guard and 12-man color party from HMCS Cornwallis, a 50-man army brass band from Halifax, 30 pipers and drummers from the Black Watch regiment at Aldershot, N.S., and an 18-man jeep assembly team from the Royal Canadian Regiment at Aldershot, N.S., and an 18-man jeep assembly team from the Horse Artillery Regiment at Debent, N.S.
The naval contingent will sail on the frigate Buckingham from Cornwallis and the army teams will sail from here on the frigate Outremont and the destroyer escort Haida. The three ships will sail into Bermuda together.
