As no water was available the fire continued to spread and the chemical truck had to be sent for. On its arrival the blaze was extinguished without further trouble. However, by that time a considerable portion of the roof had burned through and if a wind had been blowing the situation might have been much more serious.—S.

Veteran Ottawa Newsmen Dies

OTTAWA, April 26 (CP)—John Gladstone, 90, a veteran Ottawa newspaper man, died Saturday at his home today. A member of an old Ottawa family, Mr. Gladstone was a well-known political figure from Sir John A. Macdonald to Prime Minister St. Laurent. Once connected with the old Ottawa Free Press, the forerunner of the Ottawa Journal, Mr. Gladstone founded a weekly newspaper "United Canada" in Ottawa before the turn of the century. The weekly had not been published for a number of years.
