

Jealousy Among Musicians. The jealousy of musicians, whether as individuals or organizations, is proverbial, and has become a term of reproach upon them, as a class. It is an extremely rare thing to hear one singer, particularly one whose talents will not permit them to rise above mediocrity, speak in praise of another, or commend them as particularly deserving. This is most unfortunate—most fatal. Such a condition of affairs is not in keeping with that spirit of harmony and unity which ensures victory and success through the power of combination. Rather does it invite defeat by throwing wide open the gates which should be ever closed to discussion and discord, those fatal enemies to strength and concord. But there seems to be no hope of remedy or improvement in this unfortunate respect, so long as human nature is founded on self and nurtured in egotism. We must endeavor to modify the sentiment as much as possible, and endeavor at all times to regard our neighbor in kindly sympathy, magnifying his virtues and diminishing our own deserts, "in honor preferring one another." Such a condition of affairs may not be immediately possible, savoring rather of the millennium. But we may strive in this direction, and approximate as closely as possible to the precepts of the Golden Rule. We will be none the worse for it, but quite the contrary.—Folio.
