IN MEMORIAM

SANFORD PHILLIPS

One of Prince County's best known senior citizens, Sanford Phillips, passed away at his home in O'Leary on July 16th in his 75th year. Mr. Phillips was the son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Thomas H. Phillips of Ellerslie, P. E. I.

Moving to O'Leary in 1904 he purchased the farm of Thomas Glover just outside the village. For almost half a century, the deceased had been a leader in farm affairs and in agricultural organizations, in the marketing of farm produce, and in community and political concerns.

What was for the benefit of his own community, country and province, received not only his endorsements, but his active interest and support.

A private funeral service was held at the residence of the deceased for the members of the family, followed by a service in the O'Leary United Church on July 18th.

In the absence of the minister, Rev. W. G. Dickson, who was on holidays, the service was conducted by Rev. M. Sheo of Elmisdale United Church, assisted by Rev. C. O. Howlett, O'Leary Baptist Church, and Rev. Owen F. Underwood of the Church of the Nazarene.

The hymns, "The Lord's My Shepherd" and "The Sands of Time are Sinking", were sung under the leadership of the United Church Choir, Mrs. Lewis Bernard, organist. A duet was beautifully rendered by Mrs. Dan MacPherson and Mrs. Edward McDougall.

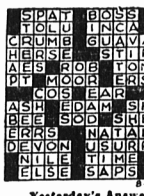

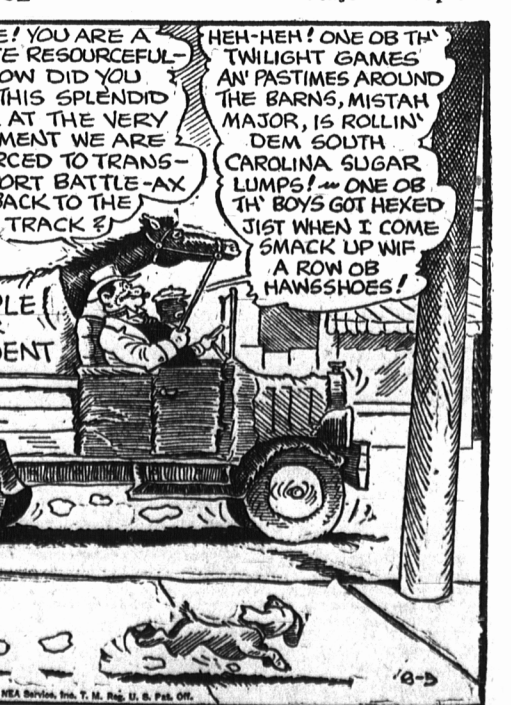
