During the first week of the Lobster Fishing season, the fishermen in this area were favoured with exceptionally fine weather and ice-free conditions. The result was that good runs were made and traps were all placed in the water within a day or so after the season opened. Inshore fishermen have so far reported fairly light catches but they anticipate an early improvement. Some of the men who fish on ground farther out in the Gulf had a very good week's total catch, with some averaging around the two thousand pound mark and several of the top fishermen working close to the three thousand pound mark for the opening week.
