I would, however, like to offer suggestions to them, that they establish future subject matters to embrace those components that relate to the first session; possibilities would be: loneliness, poverty, exploitation, fantasy and reality, television and movies, contemporary sexual mores, psychological erosion, violence and compassion, social attitudes towards alcohol and drugs, the idea of macho-ness etc.

These would be stimulating topics for conversation; and the group would stand every chance of learning from each other's insights and experience to broaden their own. And hopefully to heighten their sensitivity to these issues - and who knows - eventually make a small crack in that great mass of insensitivity, that seems to be a very threat to the future of society.
