NEW SOVIET CHIEF
 MOSCOW (Reuters)—Mikhail Ignatov was elected president of the praesidium of the Supreme Soviet of the Russian Federation, largest of the 15 union-republics that comprise the Soviet Union, Tass news agency said. He succeeds Mikhail Tarasov.

Single Unit 'Controls Climate'

Boost In Value Outweighs Expense Of Improvements

A number of research studies have shown that many millions of North American homeowners realize that their homes are less modern, less spacious or less attractive than they should be.

If you are among that group, it will not surprise you to learn that the most common question among all such homeowners is this: "How can I decide whether we'd be better off to improve our present home or to get another one... in other words when is it worth while to remodel and when is it not?"

Obviously, there can be no universal answer to such a broad question; the decision of each family depends on many factors that are peculiar to that family and to the particular house in question.

However, suggestions on how to arrive at the right decision have been devised by the Home Improvement Council—a national organization of manufacturers, dealers, contractors and others interested in the modernization field. The Council's basic purpose is to make the home owners aware of the fact that al-

most any existing home can be made completely up-to-date with an investment far smaller than that required in building a comparable new home.

HOW TO DECIDE
 Here are some pointers offered by the Council: In deciding whether or not to modernize your home, the first step is to determine as closely as possible the exact cost of the planned project. This step should involve estimates from several dealer contractors or dealers.

Then, add the cost of the project to the total of your previous investment in the home (including present mortgage debt) and look around in your community to find out what your new total investment would buy in the new home market.

You will probably find in this investigation that you will be providing your family with a great deal more space per dollar through modernization.

Another important consideration is the question of how much this new investment will add to the total worth of your home. In most sound modernization projects the cost is more than offset by the home's increased value.

"MONEY IN THE BANK"
 In fact, the Council has observed that a family's expenditure for home improvement is more like an investment—more like "money in the bank"—than any other possible purchase. Your banker will more than likely be happy to give you his opinion on your proposed project in investment terms.

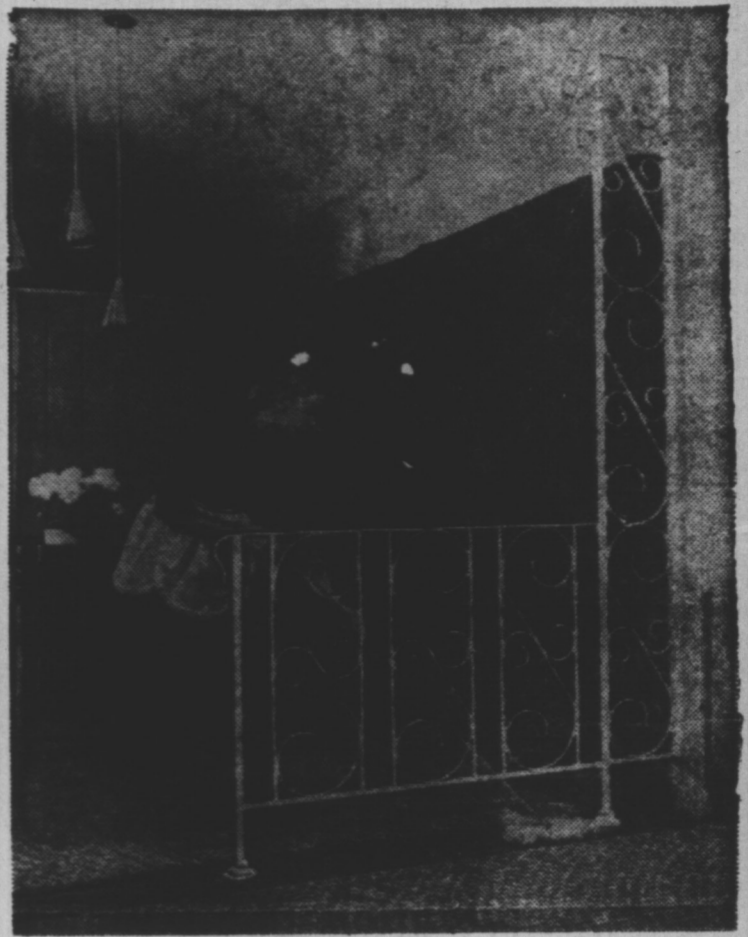
Often, however, economic considerations are over-emphasized at the expense of equally important factors of sentiment, convenience and comfort. If you are likely to remain in your present location for a number of years, there is no need to limit your modernization plans just to those that can be considered a sensible investment.

A HOME IS TO LIVE IN
 A home after all is to live in and enjoy. If it is to be a family's home for years to come, then the modern conveniences that it offers, its appearance, and its facilities for providing further recreational needs of every member of the family are just as important as financial factors.

Also, on the side of sentiment you will want to think about the neighborhood. If you live in an established home, you will probably live near established schools, churches, shopping facilities, playgrounds and the other amenities new areas frequently lack.

Modern Wonders Easy To Purchase

There isn't any part of the home, including outdoors, that can't be improved by something you just go out and buy and simply put in place or install with hand tools.

Room dividers can work magic, particularly between living and dining areas or as a visual separation at the entrance. Wrought iron railings (almost always steel, today) have now moved indoors to form graceful dividers that take up practically no space. A screwdriver installs them.

A wheeled cart makes the television set truly portable. One of the newest models permits tilting the set as much as 24 degrees to provide a more comfortable viewing angle.

Moving to the kitchen, a portable dishwasher can give mother the privilege of never having to wash dishes. It requires only plugging in and snapping the hose to a sink faucet to start its operating.
