Be Frank, a Latonia derby and Latonia Cup winner in his 3 year old season, which has been the distance running champion of Tijuana winter racing through two seasons of 100 days each; Herron, a star of Havana racing last winter; also Billy Kelly, Spania, Maize, Baby Grand, Kings Champion, Sunnyland Muttikins, Irish Dream, By Jimmy, etc.

Mr. Kilmer, whose racing establishment is now concentrated at Aqueduct, has not said definitely that he will send Exterminator to Montreal for the Cup renewal, but he is thinking the matter over seriously. Exterminator, which for three seasons has been Boniface's most formidable rival in Maryland racing—the two great horses having finished heats apart in two Pimlico Cup renewals—has not yet appeared on a Montreal track, although he has raced at Toronto and Toronto. Mr. Kilmer feels that it is up to him to give patrons of Montreal racing a slant at a gelding, which at 7 years old, is as fresh as a 3 year old, and bids fair, before he shall have finished with racing, not only to have eclipsed that of Isinglass, England's and the world's greatest garnerer of shekels. If Exterminator comes this year there need be no apprehension that he will unduly dominate the Cup renewal. As already related Boniface has run him to a head in two Pimlico Cup renewals. Moreover, Boniface beat him in the Philadelphia handicap renewal at Havre de Grace and was beaten by him by a head only in the Pimlico Spring handicap renewal.

Golden Sphaer—an English bred son of Oliver Goldsmith and Sphere of Influence is some horse himself. He packed 115 pounds and galloped one mile and a sixteenth in the King Edward Cup renewal in 1:45 flat, which is a racing good time for the heavy Woodbine course. When he won the Toronto Spring Cup, a race of one mile and a turlong, beating Boniface and Registrar, also, Brilliant Jester, Bunsy Buck and Fair Gain. Golden Sphaer finished in 1:51 2/5ths. He clipped one-fifth of a second off the old track record that had been set by Runes. Golden Sphaer is one of the most formidable British horses that has come into Canada in a number of years. The horse that beats him, very likely, will win the Windsor Hotel Cup.

Boniface won last season's renewal of the Windsor Cup. Other names of distinction on the winning roster of this \$5000 event are those of Arondack, Zeus, Plate Glass, Horrova, Waitebass, Kingly, Runes, Hanovia and Soldat de Verite. No earlier renewal of the Cup, however, ever had a group of eligibles of the quality of this season's lot from which to make up its field. The class of the continent, very nearly, is eligible to start at Blue Bonnets on June 15th next.

The Kindergarten stakes, a \$2500 (added money) race of five furlongs for 2 year olds, numbers among its eligibles the smartest baby racers now in Canada. Potential starters are Pat Casey, Buddie, St. Lawrence, Miss Miami, The Girl, Wranglo, Bucado, Elizabeth Bean, Miss Tait, Queen Cook, Trail Balzer, Radiant, Racket, Zeureka, Heeltaps, Cresta and Chicvale. Jumpers of class in the Prince of Wales, a steeplechase handicap of two miles that will be run on June 10th are Bollinger, Minata, Bighy 2d, The Truth, Last Man, Bonchie, Flying Frog, Fair Mac, Genevieve B. Sea Tale, Transpero, Overmatch, Baronet, Shoal, Nonus, Coronado, Keltie and Lieutenant Seas. The Prince of Wales will have a value of about \$3000 of which \$2500 will be added money. Bonchie won last season's renewal of this chase. Flare that of the season before.

The Connaught Cup handicap, a Challenge Cup presented by Field Marshal the Duke of Connaught and his duchess, is to be a race of one mile and a quarter for horses owned in Canada. The purse is to be \$2500. All of the good performers of the stable of Commander Ross are eligible. So are Gain de Cause, Golden Sphere, Brilliant Jester, Star Realm, Mode, Kentish Boy, etc. The Connaught Cup will be contested on June 12th. There will be some 500 horses of various ages available for the filling of the Blue Bonnets races. A meeting of seven days could easily make out with less than a thing of that number. These horses are all thoroughly seasoned and free from sickness. The American invaders shook off their spring influenza before they came into Canada. The infection has not so far appeared among Canadian thoroughbreds. No Blue Bonnets purse this season will have a value of less than \$1000 in added money. There will be several overnight handicaps of \$2000 each. These purse values represent a considerable increase over the best of the past. This advances a natural development of the policy of uplift adopted by the administration of which Commander Ross is the chief when this administration assumed the direction of racing at Blue Bonnets.

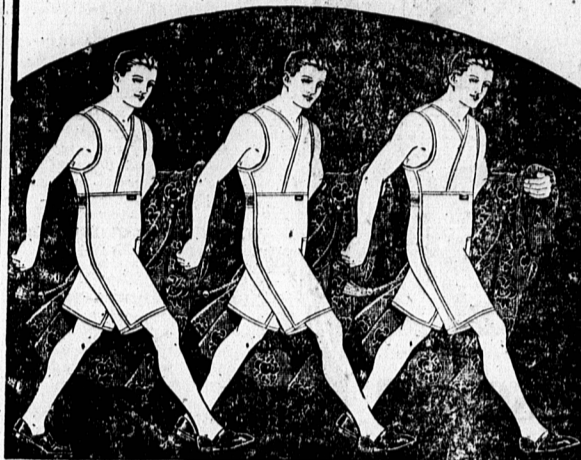
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
