COSSACKS AND BRITISH TARS

Came Near Having a Fight

DISPUTE ABOUT AN ISLAND IN CHINA

The Cossacks Drove off British Workmen—But Had to Give-Way.

[SPECIAL TO THE EXAMINER.]

SHANGHAI, Aug 28.—As an outcome of a dispute regarding the possession of some islands at Hankow on the Yang-tse-Kiang, which were purchased in 1863 by the concern of Jardine Matheson & Co, but were subsequently included in the new concessions to Russia, the owners under the advice and protection of the British Consul sent workmen to fence in the track.

After the work had begun a dozen Cossacks, from the Russian consulate appeared on the scene and forcibly ejected the workmen.

The captain of the British second-class gunboat Woodlark, especially designed for river service, after consulting with their consulate, landed a party of blue jackets and moved forward into firing distance of the Russian consulate. For a time a fight seemed imminent; but nothing further occurred.

The blue jackets are now guarding the property of the British. The third-class gunboat Esk has been despatched to Hankow.

Great Britain is evidently determined to uphold her rights.

THE DREYFUS DRAMA.

Further Action of the Government.

RENNES, Aug 28.—The government has decided to prosecute Eclair for the publication of the enaille de Document, one of the four documents secretly communicated to Dreyfus during the court martial of 1894, which has been shown not to refer to Captain Dreyfus at all.

It is rumored also that the government has decided to arrest General Mercier, but the rumor is not confirmed.

Last evening a report was in circulation that General Mercier had fled to the Island of Jersey,—but this story proved to be without foundation.

THE WINTER MAILS

Will Probably go by Way of Halifax.

HALIFAX, Aug. 28.—A despatch from Montreal says that the Allan and Dominion lines will call at Halifax the coming winter, both ways, for mails and will go to Portland, unless the U. P. R. will contract to furnish freight at St. John. If the Canadian Pacific will load steamers at St. John, the later port will be substituted for Portland.

Various rumors are current regarding the Atlantic mail contract. It is reported that the contract will be turned over to the Allan and Dominion lines at the close of the St. Lawrence navigation and that each company will employ two new boats.

THE SITUATION IN SOUTH AFRICA

The Case at its Most Critical State

PRESIDENT KRUGER MAY BE DEPOSED

Opinions of British Press on Mr Chamberlain's Speech.

[SPECIAL TO THE EXAMINER.]

LONDON, Aug 28.—There is little fresh news from the South African situation. The Pretoria correspondent of the Daily Chronicle dictates that President Kruger's concessions are so far reaching that it is doubtful whether the Burger's will ratify them. He thinks it likely that they will demand President Kruger's resignation and the appointment of a younger man, probably Schalk W. Bercher, a non-official member of Executive Council of the Transvaal.

All the morning papers comment upon the situation as revealed on Saturday by the speech of Mr. Chamberlain.

The Daily Telegraph calls the speech an informal ultimatum.

The Standard says it is "the most critical stage yet reached."

The Daily News observes: "We cannot but suppose that such grave words were well weighed beforehand."

The Times says: "Such a delicate situation cannot be protracted. We believe that within the last few days final arrangements for the general direction of the expedition which will be necessary in case of rupture will be complete. It is scarcely necessary to point out the extreme danger of allowing the entrance into South Africa of arms which would be likely to fall into the hands of a black population exceeding the white by four-fold."

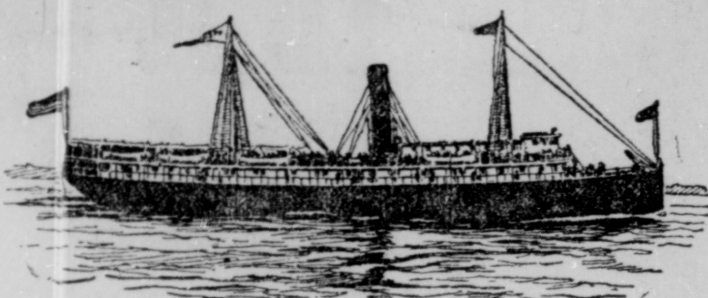
