

Yanks On Top Of League; Wynn Throws One-Hitter; Brooklyn And Giants Win

Cote Finishes 11th In 26 Mile Marathon On Sat.

YONKERS, N. Y., (CP)—Nick Costes, 26-year-old school teacher from Natick, Mass., Sunday won the U. S. Amateur Athletic Union marathon championship, covering the 26-mile, 385-yard Westchester county course in the record time of two hours, 31 minutes, 12.4 seconds.

The short, wiry distance runner finished almost two miles ahead of Rudolph Mendez of New York and was almost four minutes faster than the record of two hours, 45 minutes set by Vic Drygall in 1952. Ted Corbett of New York was third in 2:49:37 and John Lafferty of Boston fourth in 2:55:04.

Of eight Canadians who started in the race, the best showing was made by veteran Gerard Cote of St. Hyacinthe, Que. who twice previously has won the Yonkers marathon.

Brooklyn knocked off Philadelphia Phillies 8-3 but lost a half game of its National League margin to the onrushing New York Giants who ran Pittsburgh's losing streak to 11 and their own winning string to six by a double triumph 5-2 and 5-3.

Berra found Baltimore pitching a dice dish after his early season slump and fattened up with five homers in the four-game series with the last-place Orioles. Eddie Lopat threw a four-hit shutout for his first victory of the season and rookie Tom Sturdivant won the second after Whitey Ford departed for a pinchhitter.

Mickey Mantle's streak of reaching base 15 consecutive times finally was stopped when Erv Palica struck him out in the sixth inning of the first game. In the streak he had a homer, triple, two doubles, a bunt single, nine walks and was safe once on an error.

Wynn gave up only a single to Fred Hatfield in the fourth inning of his strong pitching performance that checked Cleveland's brief two-game to sing streak. Cleveland got even with the Tigers who knocked them out of first place Saturday by coming back Ed Garver and two others for his hit.

The Dodgers ran their spring spurt to 27 victories in 35 games by staging a five-run outburst in the sixth inning. Roy Campanella's 10th homer with a man on base and Carl Erskine's two-run double in the eighth tied the sixth.

Erskine had allowed only one run—Glenn Gorbous' first major league homer in the first—until homer by Del Ennis and Roy Smalley knocked him out in the ninth. Ed Reebuck mopped up Don Mueller knocked in all the Giant runs in the second game at Pittsburgh, shortened to eight innings because of rain. The right fielder's double with the bases loaded erased a 3-2 Pittsburgh lead in the eighth.
