## Tax Study Proposed

**OTTAWA (CP)** — A royal commission study of Canada's tax structure, its purpose and effects, was proposed by the Royal Canadian Mounted Police and accounting professions.

The study would cover the broad general objectives of our fiscal legislation and the economic effects of taxation during the last 10 years.

The proposal was made in a joint brief by the Canadian Bar Association and the Canadian Institute of Chartered Accountants submitted to Finance Minister Fleming and Revenue Minister Jordan.

The brief contained 80 recommendations for specific changes to federal tax laws, most of them involving complex points of corporation income tax.

One, however, proposed expansion of the five-member income tax appeal board with changes to give the board more of a judicial status.

It also urged complete revision of income tax rules dealing with taxation of "designated surplus"—earnings retained in company which are distributed to shareholders, usually when the company is reorganized.

## Shelters Said Gov't Problem

**MONCTON (C) T. C. Douglas**, leader of the New Democratic Party, says if fallout shelters are necessary "they should be built with public funds and available to everyone."

He told a press conference here that "wealthy people are the only ones who can afford private shelters. This prejudices the lower-income people who are expendable."

Mr. Douglas said most experts lean to the opinion that private shelters are of little value.

The New Party leader repeated his statement that special problems in the Atlantic provinces warrant appointment of a special federal cabinet minister able to give his full time to Atlantic development. The Atlantic provinces department was a part of his overall plan for democratic economic planning.

He said no one can blame the United States for resuming nuclear tests after the Soviet resumption, adding that the Russians displayed a "callous disregard" for human life.

## Westinghouse of Canada Reports Loss

**HAMILTON, Ont. (CP)**—Canadian Westinghouse Co. Ltd. had net loss of \$2,997,340 to 1961 compared with a net profit of \$97,812 in 1960.

Loss per share was \$1.26 compared with a profit of 50 cents a share in the previous year.

Shareholders were \$127,603,483 compared with \$123,283,474.

John D. Campbell, president, said that while there was a modest increase in over-all company shipments, continuing price depression and lower activity in electrical apparatus products more than offset improved profitability in other product areas.

## Soviet Union Will Match U.S. Tests

**MOSCOW (Reuters)** — Premier Khrushchev has warned that the Soviet Union will conduct further nuclear tests to perfect "new types" of weapons if the United States holds its atmospheric tests next month as planned.

The Soviet news agency Tass released the text of a message delivered to President Kennedy Sunday in which the Russian premier denounced the U.S. test plans as "a new expression of an aggressive course in international affairs."

At the same time Tass released a more restrained message to Prime Minister Macmillan in which Khrushchev promised the British leader Russia will do everything possible to ensure the success of next year's Geneva disarmament conference.

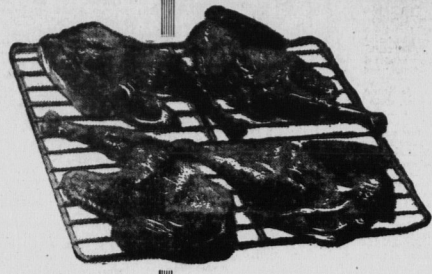
## REJECTS RAISE

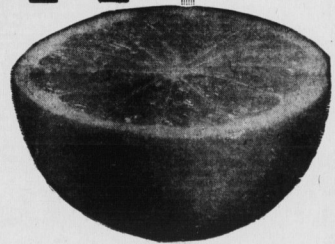
