**WHEN THE STARS FELL.**

The Shower of 1833 Worked the Negroes Into a Frenzy.

"I remember," said an old man in a high back chair, "when the stars fell in November, 1833. We spoke of it in that way then. Now you call it a meteoric shower or flight of aerolites. When I saw them in 1833, I was with a colony of emigrants. We were going from the south to the west. We had camped on a bank of the Cumberland river in Tennessee. We had our negroes with us, nearly 200.

"About 2 o'clock in the morning we were aroused from our wagons, for we were camping in them, by the wallings, shouting and lamentations of the negroes. They were in pitiful frenzy. They were so frantic that they were unable at first to explain their actions. We first discovered the cause by their repeated upward gestures, and then we saw the stars falling. In truth, it was an awe inspiring sight. They seemed to fall from the zenith to every point on the horizon. It was not the shooting motion I have seen since and which I had seen before. It was a gradual, graceful, symmetrical fall, as you may have seen in a fall of snow where the flakes were large and there was no wind. The light was peculiar, about like that which creeps over the earth when there is total eclipse of the sun.

"The whites were so busy quieting the negroes that I do not remember the length of the exhibition. I think it must have died away gradually. But I do remember that during the shower one meteor seemed to fall from the zenith perpendicularly and assumed before it vanished a wriggling motion, so that the negroes said it was the serpent that had done the mischief in Eden.

"I remember that our journey on the day following was postponed on account of the religious frenzy which took possession of the negroes. All who were old enough 'got religion,' some of them a second time, and they all insisted upon being baptized in the Cumberland river, and my father, who was a minister, administered the rite until his arms gave out, and then he delegated his authority to one of the muscular converts, who exhorted as he plunged and pulled the saved into and from the waters. But it takes something more than a shower of stars now to convert a man, whether he is white or black." —New York Sun.
