CONGRATULATES CANADA.

Sir Alfred Milner writes to His Excellency the Governor-General as follows: Government House, Cape Town, February 27th, 1900:

Dear Lord Minto—Though, as you may imagine, I have little or no time for writing, I must send you one line on the Red Letter Day to congratulate you and Canada on the great share taken by your gallant contingent in the annihilation of Gen. Cronje's force. It is the first great success we have had in the terrible struggle. The relief of Kimberley began the improvement and now, with the capture of Cronje and 4000 of his men, we have really made a substantial advance. I fear your gallant fellows suffered heavily, but on this occasion, unlike others, one has at least the satisfaction of thinking that they did not lay down their lives in vain. It is not only the immediate victory, great as that is, but the drawing together of the different parts of the Empire, which is so important. That must result from Canadians, Australians and South Africans fighting side by side with Britons from the old country, and fighting such an uphill battle, with equal gallantry, to a victorious issue. I am sure the British people of South Africa will never forget the grand assistance given them by Canada in this struggle.
