## IN MEMORIAM

It was with deepest sorrow the many relatives and friends of the late Mrs. Joseph Cutcliffe learned of her passing on the 18th in the Provincial Sanatorium, early morning of August 7th in the Provincial Sanatorium Charlottetown.

Cove; Bertha, Mrs. Albert Calbeck, Summerside and Ruth, Mrs. Jack Donovan, Pictou, N.S. A son Gordon died at the Cape Traverse, Roy, August 1956, age of 21 also two infants.

There are 20 grandchildren, six great-grandchildren; also two sisters and two brothers, Eliza, Mrs. Jewel, Concord, N.H. U.S.A. (Emily) Mrs. Seaman, Hunter River, P. E. I., William Brown, Calgary, Alberta and Melville in Bateman, Sask.

The funeral which was largely attended was held at the old home in Cape Traverse and was conducted by the Rev. Donald Nicholson. Praise selections sung were the 23rd psalm and "Unto the Hills."

## IN MEMORIAM

**JOSEPH FOSTER SKERRY**

The sad news of the sudden death of Joseph Foster Skerry on Thursday, July 25, 1957, brought deep sorrow into the homes of his parents, brothers and sisters; and his other relatives, and many friends were grief stricken upon receiving the report of his death, which occurred in La Chene, Quebec, when he and two companions were returning from Plattsburg, N.Y., to their homes in Montreal.

The automobile in which they were riding went out of control and overturned and although medical aid was immediately summoned Junior died a few minutes after arriving at St. Joseph's Hospital, a distance of about ten miles from the scene of the accident. Upon arrival at

the Hospital, he was given the last rites of the Roman Catholic Church of which he was a true member.

Junior was born 22 years ago at Tignish, the son of Joseph Foster Skerry, Sr., and his wife Evelyn Gaudet. He attended school at Our Lady of the Angels Convent and Tignish High School. Four years ago he joined the Canadian Air Force and two years later received his honorable discharge going to Montreal he secured a position where he had resided until the time of his death.

He had a pleasant disposition and a ready smile which made him a favorite with both old and young, his countless friends, who when upon hearing the sad news came in large numbers to attend his funeral and offer up their prayers for the repose of his soul with his Divine Maker in Heaven.

As his parents, brothers and sisters mourn his passing at such an early age, they will also recall the happy times spent together, as the children grew up under the careful guidance of loving parents and the family will cherish the memory of a dear and devoted son and brother.

His body was conveyed to Tignish on Saturday, July 27th, and was interred at the home of his parents where grief stricken relatives and friends called to kneel and offer up a prayer for one they loved and admired.

On Monday morning, July 29, a military funeral was held at St. Simon and St. Jude Church, Tignish. His military comrades of both world wars as well as the Air Cadet Unit of Tignish formed a guard of honor at both home and church through which the flag draped casket was carried, and then marched in solemn procession and occupied seats in the centre aisle of the church.

Requiem Mass was celebrated by Rev. M. J. Rooney, P.P., assisted by the parish choir under the direction of Rev. Sylvère Gallant.
