## QUEEN'S JUBILEE IN LONDON

Unprecedentedly Grand Pageant

EVERYTHING PASSED OFF SUCCESSFULLY.

Canada's Premier Well Received.

OTTAWA, June 23.—The world's metropolis never saw so wonderful a sight as the Jubilee function yesterday. From dawn till noon millions waited patiently for the procession which marked the glories of Her Majesty's sixty years reign. It was the greatest pageant of modern times. Everything passed off successfully, for which the Queen expressed the greatest delight.

By eight o'clock all the stands surrounding Buckingham Palace were filled, and when the colonial procession came in sight with Lord Roberts, of Kandahar, commander of the forces in Ireland, at their head, riding a superb Arabian horse, they met with a tremendous reception.

The Canadian Premier, in cocked hat and uniform and having his wife beside him, was very well received.

The Canadian troops evoked approving commendations on all sides. But the feature of the colonial procession was a detachment of Rhodesian horse, headed by Captain Maurice Giffard, a well known South African officer with his armless sleeve showing evidence of active service.

The Canadian Premier met with an especially warm reception at the Colonial stands opposite the horse guards. He afterwards said to a reporter: "I was greatly impressed by the splendor of the day's ceremonies and by the ovation received from the immense crowds."

LATEST NEWS BY WIRE AND MAIL.

LONDON, June 21.—All the colonial premiers, Mr. Wm. Lecky, the historian, and Sir Herbert Maxwell, the author, have been made privy councillors; the Prince of Wales is made Grand Master and Principal Knight of the Grand Cross of the Bath; an earldom is conferred upon Baron Egerton of Tatton, and peerages are conferred upon the Earl of Glasgow, Viscount Downe, Justice Lope, the Rt. Hon. Ion Traut Hamilton and Sir John Burns.

The Mayors of Leeds and Sheffield are made lord mayors, and the lord mayor of London, George Faudel Phillips, is made a baronet.

Bancroft, the actor, is knighted, and the chief justices of Manitoba, Montreal and Ontario, Messrs. Taylor, Taggart, Tait and Hageriv, are knighted.

The list is disappointing, as the names of many who expected honors are omitted.

Sir John Blundell Maple is made a baronet and the same honor is conferred upon Sir William Macormac, M. D., president of the Royal College of Surgeons; Mr. James Pender, son of the late John Pender, and Mr. Samuel Wilke, M. D., president of the Royal College of Physicians and physician extraordinary to Her Majesty.

Mr. Wyke Bayliss, principal of the Royal Society of British Artists, Prof. Wm. Crookes, vice-president of the Royal Society, are made knights, and Sir Francis Henry Jeune, president of the probate and admiralty division of the high court of justice, is made a K. C. B. (Knight Commander of the Bath).

LONDON, June 21.—Queen Victoria began the celebration of her jubilee yesterday, as was befitting her entire career, before the altar of her faith, while throughout London, the United Kingdom and the empire, in every cathedral, church or chapel of the established Church of England were held services similar to those at St. George's chapel, Windsor, where Her Majesty paid her devotions and offered solemn thanksgiving.

LONDON, June 21.—The queen at 8.45 this evening entertained at dinner 90 of her most distinguished guests in the state supper room at Buckingham palace. Among those present were the Prince and Princess of Wales, with all the members of the royal family, the royal guests, the envoys of states with the rank of ambassadors and the great officers of the household, who wore full court dress.

After the dinner the queen proceeded from the grand salon to the ball room to receive her guests, the envoys and their suites, the Indian princes, the officers of the imperial forces and of the native Indian escorts and the officers of the Queen's German regiment.

The colonial premiers with their wives were presented to Her Majesty by Mr. Chamberlain, secretary of state for the colonies, and the suites of royal and other guests were presented severally by their chiefs. The great officers of state attended in full court dress.

Mrs. Mesdames Whitelaw Reid, Nelson Miles and Ogden Mills, were presented by the queen's special command.
