Beaverbrook To Be In Bronze

FREDERICTON (CP)—Casting of a bronze statue of Lord Beaverbrook, to stand in the Old Officers' Square here, has been completed and it will be shipped from Naples to Canada early in July.
The nine foot statue will stand on an 11 foot stone pedestal in the square, serving as a permanent tribute from the people of New Brunswick to Lord Beaverbrook, the province's great benefactor.
The statue is being financed by contributions from citizens in all sections of the province.
The original thought for a statue came from a Fredericton night watchman, Shun Ryan, who said: "I am one of those who believe in giving bouquets to a man while he is still living rather than saying nice things about him when he is dead."

THOUGHTS FOR OUR TIME

BY HIS EMINENCE CARDINAL McGUIGAN

CAUSES OF DEEP WORRY CAN'T BE WISHED AWAY
Worry has become one of the most characteristic features of modern life. People who visit our cities from simpler cultures remark on the tense facts that they see in our streets; and we ourselves know that we often find our friends worried and full of care.
What can be done about worry? There are a lot of books out about how to stop worrying, and similar topics; and one cannot help feeling sympathy for such efforts. Many of a person's problems would be solved if only they would stop worrying!
But as soon as one mentions such a situation, one becomes aware of the irony that nearly always exists: the cheerful advice, "Don't Worry," seldom even begins to reach the heart of our problems. There are some cases where people really only need encouragement and other people can help them; but the problems that cause our deepest worries cannot be wished away.
INESCAPABLE
Such problems involve people — people on whom we depend, or who depend on us; or they involve the circumstances of our lives in such a way that nothing at all can be done about them, and in some cases we cannot look forward with confidence to any change in our fortunes at all. These are the kinds of problems that are quite inescapable; and when they press heavily on the mind there seems to be no consolation possible from any quarter.
These worries are bad enough in themselves when they fill the mind with pessimism; what often makes them worse is the fact that sometimes we ourselves are responsible for our worries and we feel not only hopeless about the future, but guilty about the past or the present. Nothing can make a person more miserable than a feeling, sometimes not completely recognized, of inescapable guilt.

What can be done about worry? Here are three suggestions — they come with no guarantee, and they will work no miracles to remove problems; but they might help a little towards living with such worries.
First of all is a piece of long-range advice. This is for people who are not yet overwhelmed by the cares of this world, but who may become so, for very few people escape them. The advice is to get in the habit of taking advice. Very few men are wise enough to decide everything for themselves. People who try to do so feel strong and independent for a while, but when they are in trouble their independence becomes for them a terrible loneliness.
My second suggestion is concerned with the feeling (or sometimes the fact) of guilt mentioned above. Human beings are not made to be guilty, and no happiness is possible, for them while they are guilty. But while the other circumstances that produce our worries

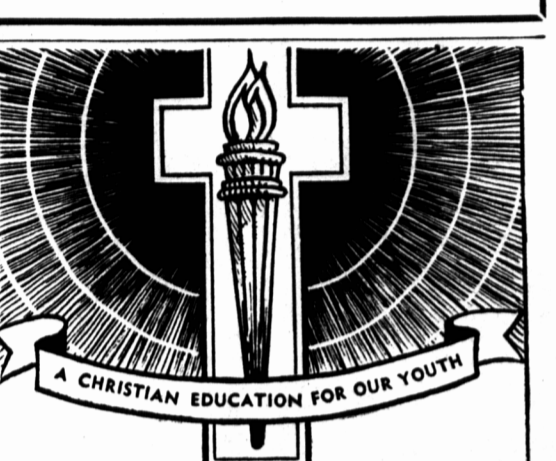

cannot always be removed, there is no reason or excuse for remaining guilty. If we have offended another person, we can do our best to make amends; if we have offended God, we know that He will always listen to a contrite heart.
PRAYER
Finally there is the matter of prayer. This is the most important advice of all. When we are worried it is very difficult not to think too much about ourselves; and none of our friends can reach us, sometimes in the world of care that we build for ourselves. But our own prayer can always reach out of this world to a Friend who has promised always to hear us.
Prayer is not easy when troubles press heavily on us. We should try to use only the simplest expressions of our love and our confidence in God; a few words repeated to ourselves over and over again, a simple thought to which we continually return; this will help to turn us from looking at our problems, or the mess we have made of things, to our only hope, to the Hand that moves the universe.
