Stock Market Was Sluggish For Past Week

NEW YORK (AP)—A sluggish stock market eased back slightly last week and remained poised above the 1956 lows.

It was agreed the market was entitled to a rest following the gyrations of the previous week when the 1956 lows, which had resisted downturns on four previous occasions, were penetrated and the market recovered all its lost ground and then some.

The Associated Press average of 30 stocks declined 40 cents to \$12.10.

It was the slowest trading week of the year, with a daily average of only 1,741,121 shares compared with last year's daily average of 2,216,272.

The upward drive on which the preceding week ended was continued only briefly last Monday morning.

SLIM TURNOVER
Lethargy deepened Tuesday when the slimmest turnover in three months was recorded, but bulls staged a rally in the otherwise sluggish and irregular market.

Oils continued their advance Wednesday and the mood spread to other groups, giving the market its only advance of the week.

Coppers were depressed early in the week by the latest series of price cuts for the red metal.

The week brought some new statistics which revealed a far from optimistic attitude among investors and traders.

The "short interest" in the exchange made its largest monthly increase since 1933 when monthly records were first kept. This refers to the number of shares "sold short" — the sale of borrowed stock made in the expectation of buying it back at a lower price.

Observers saw one bright facet to this big short-selling element. If the market declines it means that before long a "cushion" will be provided through purchases by these "shorts" to fulfill their contracts. If it rises, they will have to buy to cut their losses.

"Common Market" Decision May Be Major Turning Point

Agreement among six European countries to establish a "common market" may take future rank as a decisive occasion for Europe and the world.

The agreement — announced in Paris Tuesday — still has a considerable way to go, however, before it becomes effective.

Treaties have yet to be signed and have yet to receive ratification from the parliaments of the countries concerned — France, West Germany, Italy, the Netherlands, Belgium and Luxembourg.

Accordingly, delays may lie ahead.

However, whether or not the agreement heralds an early accomplishment, or turns out to be only one more faltering step, it seems to set a pattern for what must happen some day.

Under the plan the six countries would do away with customs and tariff barriers among themselves, over a trial period of 12 years, which may be extended for a few years longer. At the same time they would work toward establishment of a unified tariff system on imports from other countries.

The working out of such a change would have complex effects on the countries concerned — accustomed as they are to operating within their own national compartments. Presumably there would be hardship
