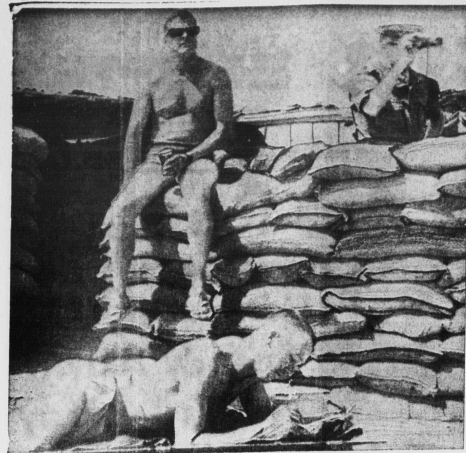

P.E.I. Hog Breeders Are Urged To Improve Quality To Compete

The need of improving hog quality in Prince Edward Island is the province is to meet the stiff competition in Nova Scotia, for example, was emphasized by Harold C. Hearty at the annual meeting of the P.E.I. Hog Quality Association held in Charlottetown last weekend.

Mr. Hearty emphasized that the present improvement in the percentage of "A" hog carcasses in Nova Scotia — they hit 58 per cent in January and February to 57 per cent in Prince Edward Island — is the result of an intensive promotional program carried on in that province for the past three or four years. The effort is beginning to pay off in Canada as well as quality, the volume department of agriculture livestock officers said.

At last count, Director L.W. He explained that the provincial department of agriculture pays a purchasing bonus of \$500 on hogs that qualify, and this is followed by an annual payment of \$10.

Mr. Hearty said that the livestock committee of the agricultural council has recommended to all departments concerned that direct contact be made to all owners of grade hogs with a view to have them participate in the hog farm policy.

Comparing the hog breeding program with cattle development, he said that more than 85 per cent of cattle in the province are bred to approved sire, while the percentage of hogs bred to qualified boars is about one-third. "We could have 75 per cent Grade A carcasses," he said, "if all of the sows bred here were mated with approved sires."

BONUS QUALIFICATIONS

To qualify for a bonus, a bear must be bred out of a dam that has scored 80 or better in advanced registry for hogs off in the 480 hours in the province.

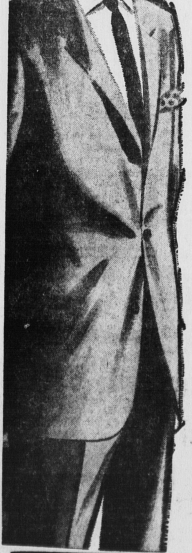
