## B.C. Luxury Bus Service Finally Overcomes Hurdle

By JACK BRAUCKMANN VANCOUVER (CP)—It takes more than a pair of buses, a few drivers and a double set of licence plates to make an international transportation company.

Ken Nordal wanted to run a luxury bus service three-hour non-stop between Vancouver and Seattle, 150 miles to the south. Accomplishing the plan brought him into conflict with some of the giants of the passenger transport industry.

And because his proposed line crossed the international boundary, it led to lengthy negotiations with state, provincial and federal governments.

The 24-year-old Victoria promoter, armed with licences and permits granted by the province of British Columbia, the state of Washington, and the United States government, Wednesday inaugurated his Seattle-Vancouver service.

He fought more than three years against the combined opposition of two bus companies and a railway line for the right to complete a non-stop service between Southern California and B.C.

Mr. Nordal's company, Vancouver-Seattle Bus Lines Ltd., now has running rights for the 150-mile trip — which will link with Continental Trailways' Golden Eagle luxury service.

Mr. Nordal has a continental franchise and is associated with some 45 other companies, of various sizes, in the Trailways structure. He has purchased two \$75,000 luxury buses which became part of a 16-unit pool for the Golden Eagle service.

The service features air-conditioned coaches with ultra-soft seating, a lounge and games area, hostesses, rest rooms and meals on board.

Beginning in 1962, Nordal's company had to fight opposition from Greyhound, Great North-
