Names of the 10 highland dancers who will represent this province at the National Fitness Festival at the Canadian National Exhibition in Toronto on Sept. 3, were announced yesterday by David Rowell, provincial director of physical fitness.

They are: Marsha Welner, Southport; Heather Burke, Charlottetown; Jack Kipping, St. John's; Tommy Burke, Charlottetown; Elizabeth Haywood, O'Leary; Marjorie MacDougall, Charlottetown; Judy Dawson, North Tryon; Evelyn Fraser, Cardigan; and Helen Brown, Kensington.

LEAVE AUG. 31
 The group will leave by a r. for Toronto on Aug. 31, accompanied by their chaperone, Mrs. Douglas McGowan, Montague. At Montague, they will meet with the Nova Scotia and New Brunswick fitness delegations. Nova Scotia's group will present a program of highland game athletics, and New Brunswick will feature Highland dancing. The Maritime provinces program is being coordinated by Donald Wetmore, Nova Scotia department of education director.

The island group was selected by a committee made up of representatives of the P.E.I. Dance Festival Association, the judges of the highland games held at Eton and representatives of the provincial department of education.

Mr. Rowell said yesterday that he has received in many questions as to how highland dancing fits into a fitness program. "Highland dancing," he said, "is a vigorous activity and the essence of fitness."

 It need not conflict with the Commonwealth, he said.

Lord Amory listed five reasons why Britain, if she can negotiate "reasonable terms," should join the market:

1. Faced with danger from behind the Iron curtain, "it must be sensible and right for the free nations of Europe to adopt a policy of co-operation in place of the old destructive policy of a permit to erect an incinerator on this site in East Royalty."

 2. While through history Britain has tried to isolate herself from events in Europe without lasting success, "the historical and geographical truth is that Britain as well as being part of the Commonwealth is a part of Europe... whether we like it or not."

3. If Europe is to increase its strength it cannot be by the way of a rivalry which might develop if both the Common Market and the European Free Trade Association were to continue in existence.

4. Britain's livelihood depends on trade and "we must... to survive—compete successfully with the manufacturer of Europe and North America in the markets of the world. We cannot with equanimity envisage the existence at our doorstep a market of 170,000,000 people with rapidly rising purchasing power from which we might be excluded."

5. An economically strong Britain is likely to be of much more use to the Commonwealth both as a trading partner and as a provider of capital and aid to the underdeveloped countries than a Britain struggling to maintain her existence.

He said the greatest difficulty confronting opponents of Britain's plan is "in finding a positive alternative policy."

Lord Amory said he was certain Britain will never "accept a commitment that would conflict with our monarch or any other fundamental part of our constitution."
