Fire Burns Large Barn

A large barn owned by George Smith, Pleasant Valley, was destroyed by fire Tuesday, with heavy loss to the owner.

The big hip-roofed structure burned, it was learned reliably, when a spark from a feed grinder set fire to the straw or chaff on the barn floor.

In addition to the feed, including the grain, Mr. Smith lost one ewe and two lambs, a neighbour said. Mr. Smith could not be reached by telephone for comment.

Mr. Smith has a large herd of cattle but fortunately they had been turned out previously, and were not in the building at the time.

Mr. Smith lives in the Pleasant Valley area but his home is located on the "Smith Road" which leads from the Malpeque Road to the South Granville area.

Driving Case Is Adjourned

John Lovat Fraser of Montague charged in City Police court yesterday with drunken driving had his case adjourned until Nov. 23, Magistrate A.J. Haslam, QC, presided.

There were three cases of unlawful possession of liquor. Two of the accused were each fined \$20 and costs or 30 days. The third offender was fined \$25 and costs or 30 days.

Two drunk and incapable were each fined \$20 and costs or 20 days, and a third remanded until Thursday.

Richard B. MacAulay, Souris, charged with failing to stop at a red traffic light was fined \$10 and costs or five days. Allan Monkey, city charged with failing to stop at a stop sign was fined \$25 and costs or two days. Louis Harding, city, charged with driving without an operator's license was fined \$10 and costs or five days.

An accused on a charge of disorderly conduct was fined \$10 and costs or five days.

Prank Results In \$25 Fine

ALBERTON — Before Magistrate W. Chester S. MacDonald at Alberton yesterday, Stephen Edward Butler of Mimitigash was fined \$25 and costs for damaging a barbed wire fence on Halloween.

John Gerald Keough, Tignish, pleaded not guilty but was convicted of failing to stop at a stop sign. He was given a \$20 fine.

Alyre Joseph Gallant of Ebbsfleet and George Peter Perry of Christopher's Cross were each fined \$10 for driving without an operator's licence.

Clifton James Gavin, Tignish, was fined \$10 for having insufficient equipment on a vehicle.

Harvey Joseph Gallant of Ebbsfleet, who had previously pleaded not guilty to a charge of impaired driving, had his case adjourned for defence evidence. At yesterday's sitting of court evidence for the Crown was given by Cst. McCue and Cst. Bennett of the R.C.M.P.

For illegal possession of liquor a resident of Tignish and a resident of Alberton were each fined \$20.

Maynard Peter Ramsay, Pleasant View, was fined \$15 for driving without a license.

Theft Cases Adjourned

Douglas J. Strickland, Marshfield, and Barry J. Gass, city, each charged on two counts of break, entry and theft were remanded to Jan. 4 with bail to stand, when they appeared before Magistrate James B. Johnston QC, in Queens County court yesterday. Gordon Tweedy is counsel for the accused.

Donald J. Noonan, Bordas, charged with being negligent in the operation of a motor vehicle was remanded to Nov. 19 for plea with bail to stand. Daniel P. Kelly, Ft. Augustus, charged with property damage valued at less than \$50 was assessed \$20 and costs or 10 days. John W. MacNeill, Milton, charged with driving while his license was suspended had his case adjourned to Dec. 7 for trial.

Marlene F. Ferguson, Hampton, charged with shooting a loaded revolver with intent to wound, had her case adjourned to Dec. 15 to fix a date for trial. A fine of \$20 and costs or 15 days was imposed, on a man charged with being intoxicated in a public place and a man charged with illegal possession of liquor had his case adjourned until Nov. 24.

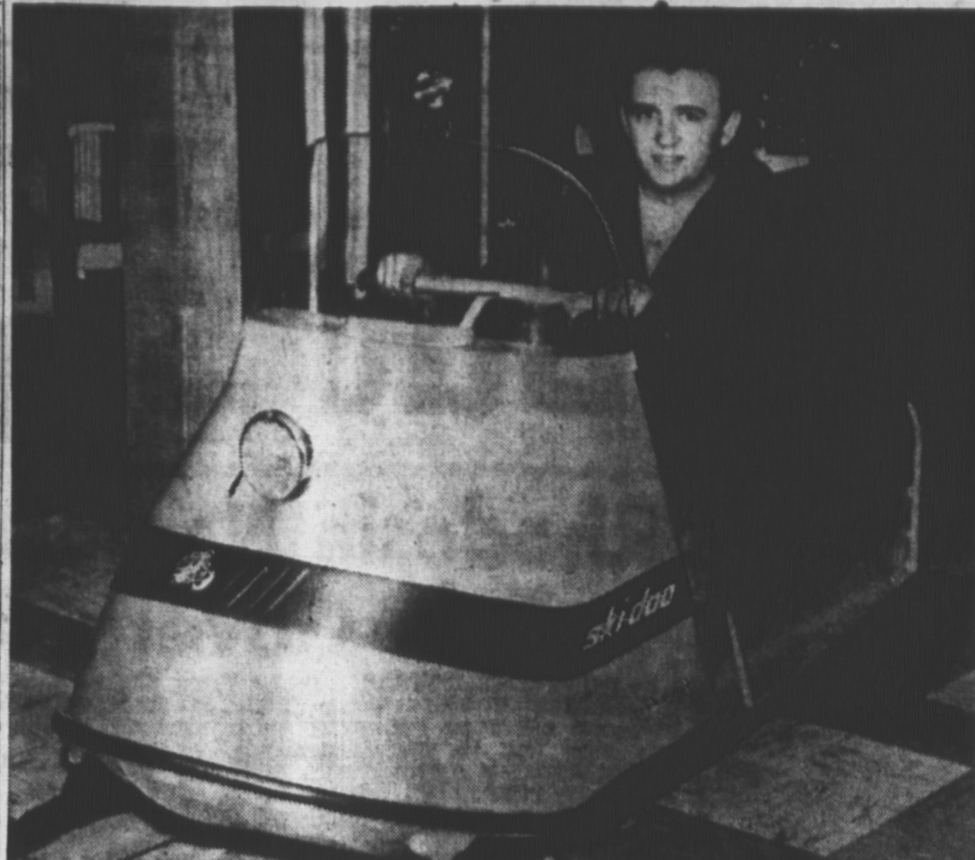

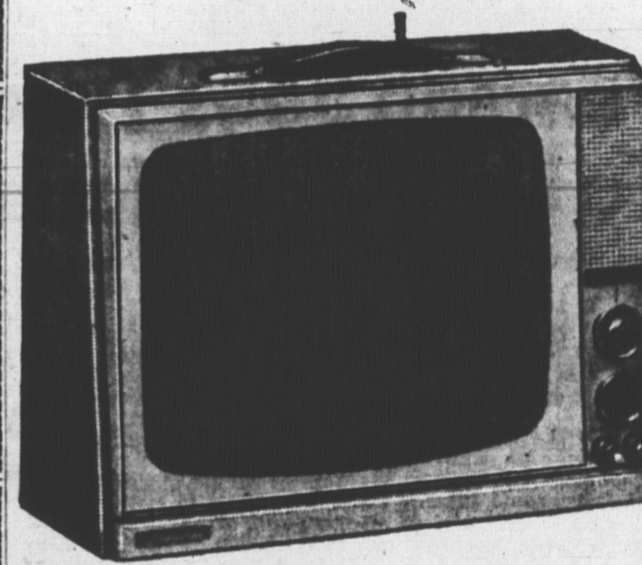
