BIG BROTHERS BOWL FOR MILLIONS

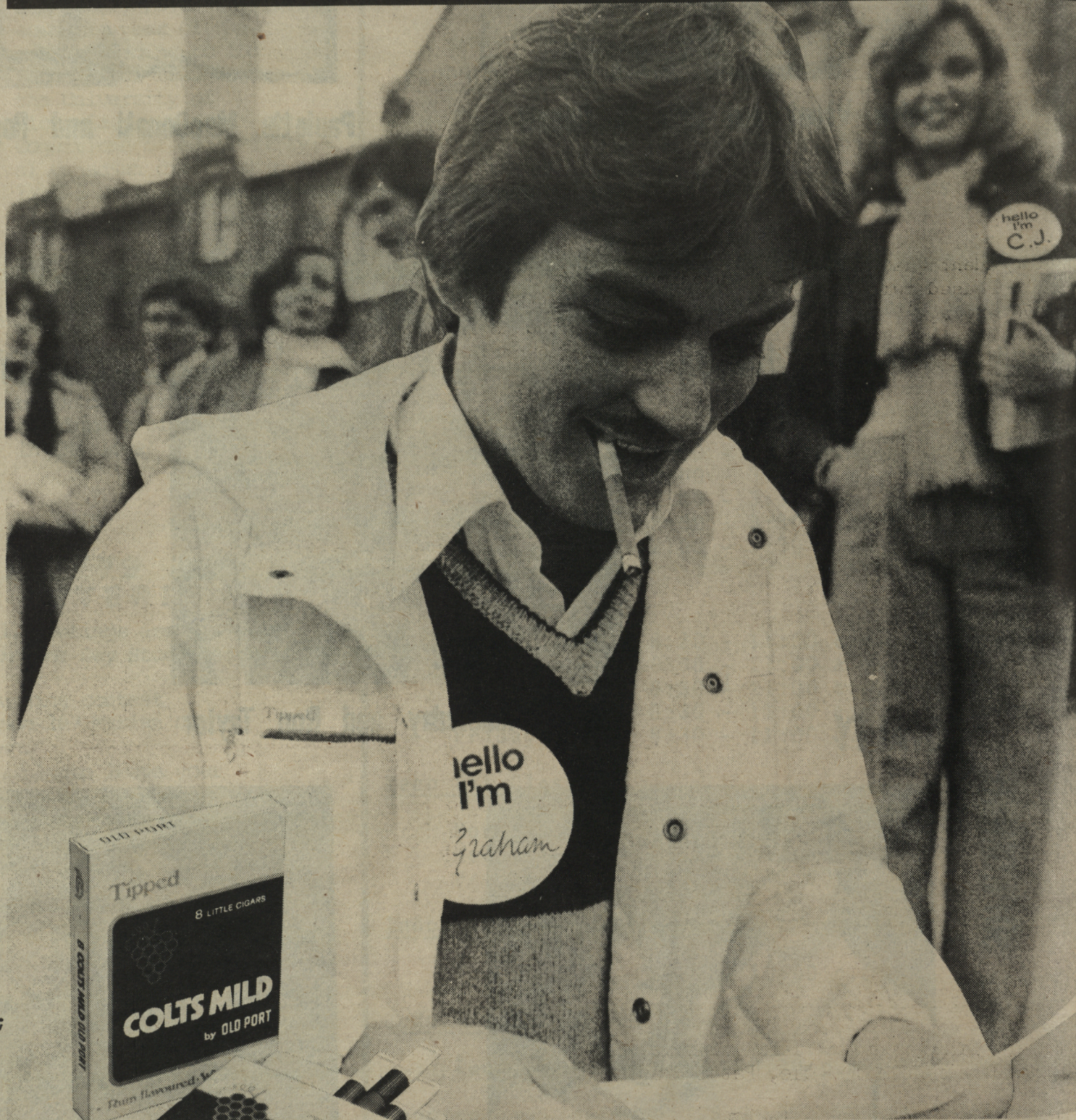
