Predicts Canada In For A Tough Winter Economically

LONDON (CP)—The Financial Times says Canada, economically speaking, may be in for a tough winter.

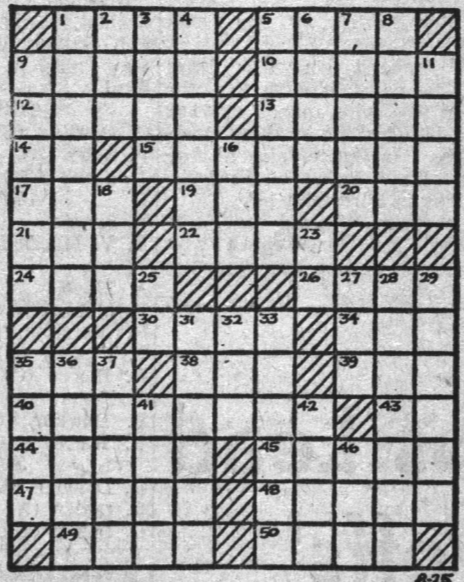
In a review of the Canadian economy, the newspaper's Ottawa correspondent predicts the number of workers unemployed this winter will be higher than a year earlier when at one time almost 10 per cent of the labor force was out of work.

"Few Canadians are counting on any major pickup in the economy this year," the newspaper says Canada can hardly expect to escape the coming winter with the "remarkably small" degree of dislocation and distress experienced last winter.

"In the coming winter the unemployed must be expected to be larger in number as well as proportionately; but the numbers facing real need will increase even more. There will be more workers who have not done enough work during 1958 to entitle them to insurance payments, and these same people (with others) will also have a smaller se-
