Science Gaining More Knowledge To Offset Fisheries Problems

OTTAWA, Dec. 8, 1950 - Development of the great potential commercial fishery resources of Canada to obtain their maximum use depends largely on the efforts of a comparatively small group of Canadian scientists, Geographical Journal.

Writing on "Science in Fisheries" Mr. Manchester, who is a member of the staff of the Federal Department of Fisheries, tells the story of the Fisheries Research Board of Canada from its early beginning aboard a scow off St. Andrews, New Brunswick in 1899. Today this group of biologists, oceanographers, chemists, bio-chemists, bacteriologists and engineers is recognized as constituting one of the most effective fisheries research institutions in the world.

The Board's biologists have found commercial quantities of the elusive gideye in Lake Claire, Alberta. They have discovered new stocks of whitefish off Newfoundland. Oyster culture techniques have been de-

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American Import Regulations For Canada Amended

OTTAWA, Dec. 16 - It was announced previously that certain changes in the United States regulations regarding the entry of Canadian livestock into that country had become effective as from August 14. These changes were not implemented for that date, but became effective as from December 10. The changes follow.

Canadian cattle offered for entry to the United States need not be tested for Brucellosis (Bang's disease), if they are accompanied by a certificate issued or endorsed by a veterinarian of the Canadian Government showing they were officially vaccinated as calves 6 to 8 months of age, in accordance with Canadian Government Regulations, within 22 months of their being offered for entry to the United States. The certificate accompanying such vaccinated cattle must show the date of vaccination of each animal.

The Government regulations cover only those cattle which have been vaccinated according to the requirements of the Federal-Provincial Brucellosis Control Program, and cattle which have been vaccinated under other conditions will not be accepted for entry to the United States without being blood tested negative to Brucellosis, unless they are classed as animals for which a blood test is not required, such as cattle for immediate slaughter steers, or spayed heifers.

The 6 to 8 months age range for vaccination actually means that calves may be classed as "officially vaccinated" if vaccinated at 6 months of age, and up to but not including 9 months of age.

Canadian poultry exported to the United States must be accompanied by a certificate of a Canadian Government veterinarian showing that the poultry have been inspected on the premises of origin and are free of any evidence of communicable disease or exposure thereto. Under certain conditions the United States authorities may authorize the importation from Canada without such certificate, of eggs for hatching, newly hatched poultry, and poultry consigned for immediate slaughter.

Death follows the appearance of these nervous symptoms in 50 per cent or more of the cases. Those that do recover often left with permanent brain or nerve tissue damage. The symptoms may not always be as severe as this however, and instead, the pup may show only a slight eye discharge and may not be feeling up to par. Nevertheless, it is still capable of transmitting the virus to fox and mink. A few dogs that have apparently recovered from an attack of distemper may be carriers and potential spreaders of the virus for a short period of time.

In the majority of cases the virus is transmitted by direct contact of the distemper infected dog with the fur bearers. The infected secretions of the sick dog may be transmitted for short distances through the air by coughing or sneezing. Since it is probable that in many instances transmission is also effected through, or by way of contaminated food or dishes, the dog should not be allowed in either the feed house or the yards.

Handling . . . The first thing to do is to get the suspected dog out of the enclosure and away from the feed house and to consult your veterinarian. If the veterinarian diagnoses the condition as distemper, he should give the dog large inoculations of distemper antiserum with antibiotics and supportive treatment. Treatment should not be delayed a 24 hour delay may mean the difference between life and death. If the dog did have distemper and has had access to the animals, there is a chance that it has exposed a few mink or fox to the virus. With this in mind, a good procedure to follow would be to closely check all of the mink or fox each day for beginning symptoms. As in any communicable disease, it is far better to stop an outbreak in its early stages than try to hold down the losses later.

We know many mink farmers who keep dogs within the guard fence for protection purposes. This is permissible if the dog is vaccinated and not allowed to roam the neighborhood and expose itself to distemper and/or other diseases and carry them back to the fox or mink. For the period during the distemper vaccination and one month after the last inoculation, the dog should be isolated from the fox and mink. In rare instances, the dog may show a severe reaction (distemper break) and could possibly transmit live virus to the fur bearer. Under no circumstances should a stray dog be allowed in the yards.

The following is a brief report of the mink sales held the past week . . . At Montreal the Hudson's Bay Company special mink sale revealed a continued strong demand with prices unofficially estimated at 30 per cent above the December sale of last year in the case of ranch mink, which was four-fifths of the catalogue. The offering consisted of 45,000 skins. Males, extra dark, brought \$20.50 to \$30.; extra dark part dark, \$25. to \$31.50; dark, \$19. to \$30.50; dark and dark brown, \$23. to \$25.50; females extra dark, \$15. to \$18.; dark and dark brown, \$13. to \$15.75; extra dark and dark \$13. to \$17.50; one-half, \$12.50 to \$17.75; ranch mink seconds - two, male top \$12.50; mixed, part damaged, \$12.75 top. Pastels, males \$25. to \$43.; mixed males and females, \$23. to \$35.; females, \$14.75 to \$24.50; Breach of Spring, mixed, \$31.50; Silverblue males, \$19.75 to \$39.50; mixed, \$18.75 to \$27.50; females, \$16.25 to \$23.

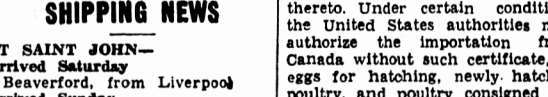
