The British treasury last year received an increased revenue of £900,000 on alcoholic spirits, £375,000 on beer, and £456,000 on tobacco. The Montreal Gazette remarks that England is fairly prosperous at the moment, and it would appear that her sons had drunk to a continuance of her good luck in a way to startle the teetotal movement out of several years' growth.

A recent writer calls attention to the alarming condition of the French finances. The national debt amounts to 31,646 million francs, the annual charge on which is 1,318 million francs. From time to time new loans are floated by popular subscription, but in order to ensure their success the Government is obliged to fix the price at a figure below that of the older securities; that is to say, it takes less for them than they are really worth. The object of this is to place the national securities in the hands of as many Frenchmen as possible—a good thing in its way, but one which is attended with drawbacks. For in order to force the loans upon small holders the Government taxes joint stock companies heavily and discourages investment in every other form of security.
