North Koreans Use German-Type Guns

Highlights Of Speech

OTTAWA, Aug. 7 — (CP) — Highlights of Prime Minister St. Laurent's broadcast:
An Army Brigade to be known as the Canadian Army Special Service Force will be recruited beginning immediately to be "available" for service in Korea.
A special session of Parliament will be called in six or seven weeks time to give effect to this and other defence moves. It will be called before that if necessary.
Canada is "pressing on" with recruiting for the permanent Army, Navy and Air Force, all of which are being expanded, as well as for the Reserve Forces.
Production of the new all-weather jet fighter, the CF-100 Canuck which in tests has "exceeded expectations", is being accelerated.
Canada is expanding her capacity to produce the Canadian "Orenda" jet aircraft engine.
Production of naval vessels, armament, ammunition, radar and other types of war equipment is being stepped up.
In all these things Canada is working in "the closest cooperation with the United States to the end that our joint resources and facilities are put to the most effective use in the common defence effort."
For her new special brigade Canada wants "young men, physically fit, mentally alert, single or married" and particularly veterans of the Second World War.
Canada is not taking these steps to "make war" but rather in the hope of preventing it.
Canadians owe it to themselves and their children to do everything "human foresight can suggest" to prevent the disaster of a third world war.
