MISTREATING AN ACE
WEST'S treatment of an ace
was cruel and inhuman in the
following hand:
North dealer.
North-South vulnerable
K5 AK107
A10
AQ1088
A J62 N 984
54 Q54 W J662
976 K QJ9
52 K J4

The bidding:
North East South West
Pass 1 Pass Pass
2 Pass 2NT Pass
6NT(1) Pass Pass Pass

two-notrump call—he had merely
gone along with North—hence,
even a leap to five notrump would
have been inexcusable.

West, despite the opening club
bid at his left, decided to lead a
low club. South captured East's
jack with the singleton king, and
then, since he would need a spade
trick in any event, he led low to-
ward the spade king.

Right there, West made a horri-
ble play: he put the spade ace!
Then he exited with a low spade.

Declarer was now a lot closer
to home than he had been, and he
did not rebut the opportunity so
kindly provided. He cashed dum-
my's three good clubs, discarding
two diamonds and a heart from
his own hand. East, having to
guard both hearts and diamonds
let go two spades. Now South led
a low heart to his queen and
cashed the queen of spades. The
club was discarded from dummy
and—East was fixed. Whether he
let go a heart or a diamond, South
could easily win the rest of the
tricks.

If West had not been so quick
to part with his spade ace, South
(in the parlance of experts)
"would still be playing the hand."
