TELEGRAPHIC NEWS.

(SPECIAL DESPATCHES TO THE EXAMINER.) Skating Tournament closed. ST. JOHN, N. B., Feb. 19. The concluding night of the Lunenburg Rink skating tournament attracted fully one thousand persons. The event was the five-mile amateur championship of Canada and the medal presented by the officers of the N. B. E. G. Artillery. Frank Dowd, of Montreal, was winner, with Craft, of St. John, a fair second. Charles Whitley met with an unfortunate accident. The blade of his long race skate became loose, tripped him, and he fell. He was leading at the time, and many of his friends believe the race was his if it had not been for the accident.

Parliamentary Matters. LONDON, Feb. 18. The House resumed the debate on the Address in Reply to the Queen's Speech. Lord Randolph Churchill, and the rank and file of the Tories, abused and worried Gladstone, and provoked from the Prime Minister a dignified speech, in which he said the Government had a severe and difficult task, which it would endeavor to perform resolutely, and as speedily as possible. In the House of Lords the Tories vainly tried to goad Lord Rosebery, Foreign Secretary, to speak on the situation in the East.

What Gladstone Says. LONDON, Feb. 18. In the Commons Gladstone said the desire of the Government was to propose to the House measures of a positive and substantial character dealing with Ireland, respecting social order and questions of land and the future Government of Ireland, including the method for such Government. He said a further statement on the subject would be made on the 22nd March. Alluding to the foreign policy of the new Government, Gladstone said he would follow the Eastern policy inaugurated by his predecessor, Lord Salisbury.

Home Rule for Ireland. LONDON, Feb. 18. The leading members of the Conservative party met at the Carlton Club at noon to-day, to confer upon the course the party shall pursue in regard to Irish affairs on the re-assembling of Parliament. Lord Salisbury, late Prime Minister, presided. Lord Randolph Churchill and other prominent Tories were present. The speeches made indicate an intention on the part of the Conservatives to offer most strenuous opposition to any measure presented by the Liberals concerning Home Rule.

John B. Gough Dead. PHILADELPHIA, Feb. 18. John B. Gough, the famous temperance orator, died this evening. He was attacked by apoplexy on Monday last while lecturing and fell prostrate to the floor. He never rallied. He was 69 years of age.

Prohibited. VIENNA, Feb. 18. The project of recruiting a Hungarian legion for service in the Serbian army has been prohibited, and the Government has also forbidden the exportation of horses from Bosnia and Herzegovina.

To Visit Belfast. BELFAST, Feb. 16. Lord Randolph Churchill will visit this city next Monday. The Orangemen are arranging a public reception for him.
