Calgary Graphics At Centre Gallery

The Fifth Annual Calgary Graphics Exhibition (1965) has arrived at Confederation Centre Gallery for a three-week stay. The annual show, one of the leading exhibitions of its kind in Canada, has been organized by the National Gallery of Canada in co-operation with the Art Gallery of the Alberta College of Art.

Artists from all ten provinces have contributed to this major contemporary collection of the graphic artists' art where the sole criteria for selection is quality.

The instructions to the sole juror amply make this point clear: "Quality is and has been the keynote of the show. Matters of style, of taste, of currently fashionable trends, are not to be considered. Quality alone is to govern the selection, and give homogeneity to the show."

Thus the selection of graphics does not represent an attempt at ranging the broad spectrum of graphic arts but rather the individual taste of the current juror.

Probably because of this the exhibition has been charged simultaneously with being avant garde in the extreme, and reactionary in the extreme, during its six-year history.

Thirty-seven etchings, woodcuts, embossed prints, linocuts and other examples of the graphic artists' technique make up the show. The subject matter includes portrayals of the commonplace, as well as the un-

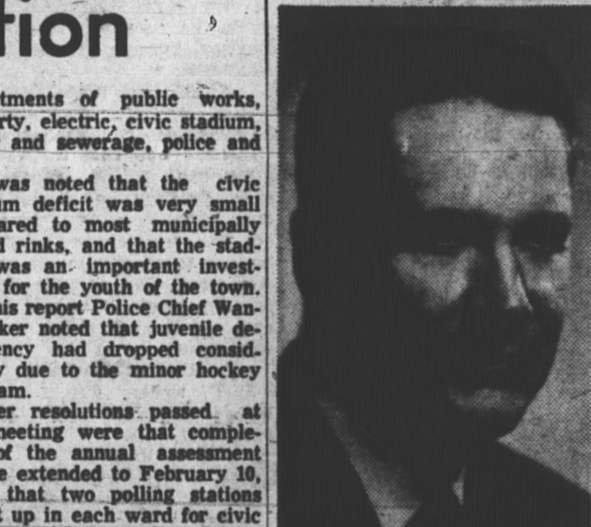
PROBE ACCIDENT
