

-2 Pictures Said To Show Many Red Space Failures

WASHINGTON (CP) — The chief press officer of the North American Air Defense Command says photographs taken by high-flying U-2 reconnaissance planes over Russia showed that the Soviet Union had a great number of space failures as well as successes.

Col. Barney Oldfield said in a telephone interview from Colorado Springs, Colo., his knowledge of these failures comes from information resulting from photographs made by the United States reconnaissance planes, including those made by Francis Gary Powers.

Powers fell into Russian hands May 1, 1960, when his plane either was shot down or crashed about 1,200 miles inside Russian territory. He was flying at an altitude of 60,000 feet. He was released by the Russians last month in a swap for Russian spy Col. Rudolf Abel.

Elaborating on a statement he had made at Fort Worth, Texas, three days ago, Oldfield said the photographs taken by the U-2 planes over a period of some four years gave the U.S. a great deal of information on Soviet military power, including location of missile and atomic sites, aircraft and submarine production and rocket developments.

Former President Eisenhower called off the U-2 spy flights May 14, 1960, two days before Soviet Premier Khrushchev used the covers case to cancel the May 18 summit conference in Paris.

SPY PARALYZE U.S.
"But this didn't leave us especially paralyzed on getting Soviet intelligence," Oldfield said without elaboration.

Former defense secretary Thomas Gates told a congressional committee June 2, 1960, that the U-2 flights showed Soviet military strength to be impressive but in some aspects "perhaps less than they advertised."

Oldfield, speaking at a space writers' conference at Fort Worth, said plane reconnaissance showed that at one time Soviet rocket launching pads were photographed with rockets in place. Later U-2 photographs showed only scorched earth remained.

Knowing from world-wide listening devices that the Russians hadn't put anything in orbit from these sites, Oldfield said the U.S. concluded that whatever was set off from those launching pads must have exploded at the sites.

Oldfield suggested also that the remains of a Soviet satellite which continues to orbit the earth may perhaps contain the body of a Russian astronaut.

FIRST COSMIC COFFIN?
In the telephone interview, Oldfield said he was referring to the May 14, 1960, Russian space shot. He said he told the conference he didn't know what the Russians had put into orbit but if it had been a live Russian, Russia now could claim to be the first country to have a cosmic coffin in a celestial cemetery.

Sen. Fort Worth dispatches of Oldfield's speech reported he stated definitely that the satellite now in orbit contained the body of a Russian. However, in the interview, Oldfield said he was asked in Fort Worth whether the satellite could have contained a live Russian and he replied that if it had, then Russia had the distinction of having the first cosmic coffin.

The U.S. defense department was amazed with queries about Oldfield's speech but said it would make no comment.

However, Oldfield's remarks raised new mysteries about the Russian satellite. At the time of launching, Moscow announced it was orbiting a "dummy" spaceman and would try to bring him back into the atmosphere where the space capsule was supposed to disintegrate.

Later, some American scientists speculated that it wasn't a dummy in the capsule but a live astronaut. Something went wrong in ground control over the manuever and instead of moving closer to earth, it moved away after several days of orbiting. Western astronomers suggested the cabin contained the "dummy" had separated.

ACCEPT NUCLEAR TESTS
CANBERRA (Reuters)—Australia has no objection to the resumption of nuclear atmospheric tests on Christmas Island in the Pacific, Prime Minister Robert Menzies told the House of Representatives Tuesday. He said he had told British Prime Minister Macmillan an announcement of the agreement with the United States on a possible resumption of tests.

Argue Reports He's Prepared To Contest Assiniboia Seat

REGINA (CP) — Hanson Argue has revealed he is prepared to let his name stand for the Liberal nomination in Assiniboia constituency.

A Liberal nominating convention has been set in Assiniboia for March 20.

"I would prefer to run in Assiniboia constituency — that is my first choice—but my possible nomination is conditional upon the wishes of the Liberal Party supporters there," Mr. Argue said in an interview.

He said he considered it "presumptuous" for the Assiniboia NDP Constituency Association to ask for his resignation on party-switching grounds.

The association Monday asked Mr. Argue to resign and asked Prime Minister Diefenbaker to call an immediate by-election should he quit.

Said Mr. Argue: "It seems a strange procedure is being taken in this particular instance because there was no outcry when CCF members of provincial legislatures in Ontario, Manitoba and British Columbia switched in mid-terms to the New Democratic Party without first resigning and seeking re-election."

New Regulation Spurs Interest Of Immigrants
NEW YORK (CP)—Canadian Immigration offices here have received a flood of applications to enter Canada following the easing of restrictions with regard to race and nationality.

H. W. P. Thomson, officer in charge of the immigration office here, said:

"The new regulations went into effect Feb. 1. Since then we've had applications from citizens of India, Pakistan, Cuba, Venezuela and Chinese people."

Thomson said that under previous regulations most African, Asiatic and South American national could not become Canadian citizens unless they fit within limited quotas or had close relatives who were Canadian citizens.
