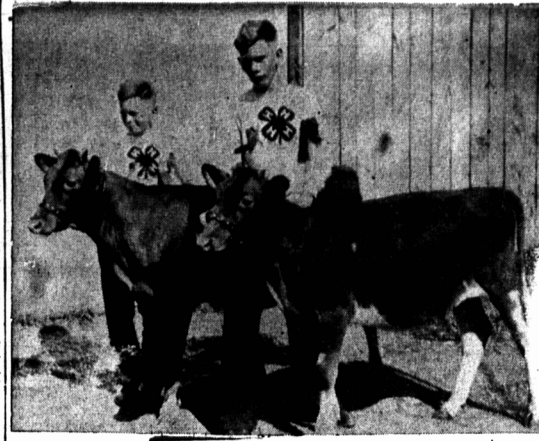
Rev. Hatfield Dymont was the guest preacher at the Tyne Valley United Church on Sunday morning August 28th. A large congregation was in attendance.
