It was reported Friday by Dr. George Dewar, minister of education, that the \$232,000 allotted to Prince Edward Island under the federal student loan program has been 'pretty well used up for this year'.

Under the program, university students may borrow up to \$1,000 per year for five years, paying back the loan after graduation. Another education official said this morning that if there were more applications next year than the provincial allotment can absorb, loans will have to be scaled down so that students will not be able to get a full \$1,000 loan.

Indian Switch Said Move To Appease Quebec

Ottawa (CP) - Conservative Erik Nielsen has accused the government of trying to hand Indian affairs to the provinces in order to appease Quebec. Speaking on the spending estimates of the Indian affairs branch, Mr. Nielsen said a government plan dealing with Indians appears to be an indirect device to meet Mr. Levesque's demands for jurisdiction over the 2,500 Eskimos of northern Quebec.

Distinctive Military Air To Greet Royal Couple

Guards of honor, militia groups for crowd control, bands and house guards will give the royal couple a distinctive military touch during the Queen's Visit here beginning Monday.

From the time Her Majesty steps from the Royal Air Craft at Summerside and Summerville a military group of all forms will be in evidence all during the tour.

When the Queen lands at Summerside, a 100-man Royal Guard of Honor from the RCAC Station will be on hand. Music for the occasion will come from the Central Band of the RCAP.

The P. E. I. Company, No. 7 Company of the Canadian Guards 2nd Battalion, will form the Royal Guard at the department of transport wharf in Charlottetown for the arrival here of Queen Elizabeth and Prince Philip on HMV Britannia. With them will be the Guards band.

Firing the Royal Salute both at Summerside and this city will be a troop from the Royal Canadian Horse Artillery at Camp Gazette.

The Canadian Guards will also provide the Household Guard for the time when Her Majesty is officially in residence at Government House on Wednesday.

The largest number of uniformed groups and school children ever to line the streets of Charlottetown for a Royal Visit will be participating in the courtesy to Her Majesty Tuesday and Wednesday.

Plans have been completed and areas allotted to each contingent so that the entire route over which Her Majesty will travel at any time will be covered by organized groups of military and civilian personnel.

Several hundred sailors from the destroyer escort accompanying Her Majesty will participate.
