Pair Given Jail Term On Negligence Charge

SUMMERSIDE — A \$1x month sentence in Prince County Jail was imposed Monday morning on Donald Alexander MacPherson of Parkdale, found guilty by a Supreme Court jury, of criminal negligence in the operation of a motor vehicle causing bodily harm to Elizabeth Charlotte McKenna, of Bonfay, on May 9, 1962, at Carleton Place.

In passing sentence, Mr. Justice R. R. Bell said that "in general sense I do not consider you are a criminal, but you do have broken the law and must pay the penalty."

Mr. Justice Bell added that Mr. MacPherson had had a fair trial, and had been well defended by counsel.

He said "you must be taught a lesson, but in your case a long term of imprisonment is not warranted."

In his address to the judge, defence attorney J. Watson MacNaught, pointed out that the jury had included a recommendation for mercy.

Mr. Justice Bell stated that the previous good record of his client, and requested a suspended sentence.

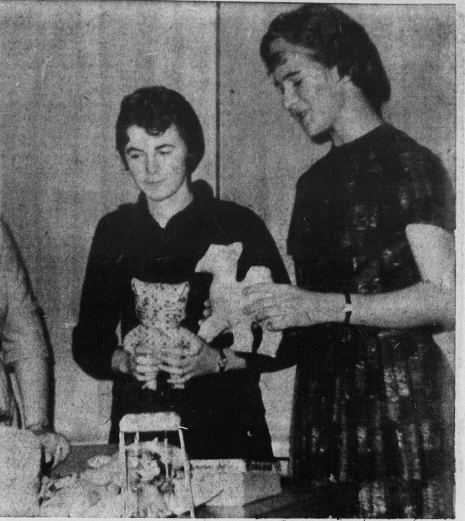

SUMMERSIDE — The Summerside Junior Chamber of Commerce is considering sponsoring a community development program for this area and are currently studying the resources development program as outlined by the provincial department of research.

Hartwell Daley, provincial research director, who spoke to the IC's at their recent bi-monthly meeting held at Small's Tourist Home and explained how community development programs operate and their affiliations with ARDA.

"The resources development program is a new approach to help you and your neighbours attain a greater level of prosperity and satisfaction," he stated. "You can utilize this program by interesting your local people in taking part in the program you will join in studying the ways in which communities have made progress with plenty of real life stories of things that have been done."

(Continued from page 1) Mr. MacRae said the Liberal proposal could in the long run mean a lot of "free money" instead of saving it. "I am afraid it is important price more likely to become a ceiling than a floor and the market price would fall to rise above that."

He said prospects for P.E.I. potatoes this winter are relatively good because a lot of general supply situation in the United States and central Canada. The estimated value of U.S. production was of \$30,000,000 because of a large proportion of small sizes.
