St. Leger Stakes September 7

LONDON (CP) — The Jockey Club announced Wednesday night the St. Leger stakes, one of Britain's five flat-racing classics, will be run this year on a Wednesday, Sept. 7.

The decision, reached after consultation with government authorities, including the proviso that the St. Leger should be run on a Wednesday for two years, with experience in 1955 and 1956 determining when future events should be held.

Some industrial authorities wanted the St. Leger to revert to a Saturday date to avoid mid-week absenteeism. Track officials claimed a Saturday would cause traffic chaos. On a good day the stakes might draw up to 200,000 persons.

The St. Leger, run over 1 1/2 miles, is the last big race of the season for three-year-olds and was won last year by Never Say Die.
