

Graduates Hear Inspiring Words From Senator Inman

Following are excerpts from the address given yesterday by Senator F. Elsie Inman to the graduates at the convocation of Prince of Wales College.

"The Poet Laureate of Greece, Kostas Palamas - in one of poems extorts the Greeks not to gloat over the glory of ancient Greece, but winning new laurels, to demonstrate to the world that they are worthy descendants of glorious ancestors. 'Life is in front of you' he says.

"Someone said that God gave us memory so that we might have roses in December, - roses that continue to bloom all through our lives - the perfume of which will go with you along the road on which you will soon set forth and preserve for you the priceless treasures of past thoughts and memories - many of which have been planted within the classrooms of Prince of Wales College.

"The ambition of most young people today, I think, is to climb educational ladders as high as possible to improve their educational standing among their fellow men. This is a most worthy ambition and one which if followed must bring eventual success. It was Walt Whitman who said, 'It is provided in the essence of things that from any fruition of success no matter what, shall come forth something to make you better or stronger, necessary.' So as you move along the pathway of life play the game for what it's worth and do not look for a bargain. Pray for the courage and strength to face the responsibilities that will come in the years that lie ahead. Make life what you want it to be by wanting something worthwhile for yourself and the world in which you live. Have faith in yourself and life will be a glorious adventure.

NEVER-ENDING PROCESS

"An education is not an entity developed in a few years of study and delivered with a diploma. It is a never ending process, built up over the years of experience. How well we are educated is simply a matter of how well we have adjusted ourselves to our lives and our environment. Whether we have enlarged our horizons or been content to stay down between the hills - there is always something to be learned - all through life. Many of the interests which broaden and enrich our lives and careers are developed long after college days are over.

"It was that most eloquent of the Fathers of Confederation Thomas D'Arcy McGee, who bade us welcome every talent, hall every invention, cherish every gem of art, foster every gleam of authorship, honour every acquirement and every natural gift. He knew that consciousness of talents and abilities, bearing fruit in our own generation is something apart from those that have come to us from the past. And there is the great satisfaction of personal accomplishment in developing these

talents and abilities. Abraham Lincoln, the great American President said 'you cannot help men permanently by doing for them what they could and should do for themselves.' So learn to be self-reliant, self-sufficient, - earn whatever liberties and benefits life may give to you.

"And to quote Bernard Shaw, 'This is the true joy in life, the being used for a purpose recognized by yourself as a mighty one. SUPREME NEED

"Education is a supreme need for a democratic country such as ours. There can be no real freedom where people are ignorant and no real progress can be attained in a country without education among its citizens. Everyone is entitled to an education which will aid him to develop to the limit of his abilities. But you can only buy education on the installment plan - and you can only pay for it by honest effort.

"The foundation of our present civilization are the Home, the Church and the School. But of course our interests expand and develop as time goes on. Time is of the essence - not to be wasted, but expended in the best interests of success.

"Desire, determination and dedication are the ingredients of success. Have a definite goal - one worthy of attainment and set your sights on that. - Perseverance and concentrated endeavor will ensure success. And now, what is 'success'?" The Dictionary defined it as 'accomplishment of a purpose' or 'one who has prospered and won high standing.' But many people define it as 'the attaining of what you want while you still want it.'

I personally have a very great and sincere respect for our young people of this generation. They are keenly aware of the influences and pressures that are today instrumental in molding their characters. They are preparing themselves for life when they must strike out on their own. They are stable young Canadian people with an eye on where they are going, and a clear understanding of how they are going to arrive there.

PRACTICAL VALUES

"Schools and colleges are the master sculptors, capable of molding to a great degree the final product of the educated young people of this country.

"The acquiring of education is important, very important, but putting education to practical use is much more important to most of us.

"Three things you must take with you as you leave this Hall and enter another road along which you will travel. You must have a sense of humor, a large measure of pity and compassion and an abiding love of the beautiful. Follow the good, the beautiful and the true. With these human attributes and application to your chosen career success should be yours.

"So I say to you young Graduates - courage; face life and meet the unseen with confidence. Do not fear the future, prepare for it and meet it squarely. Be optimistic, for optimism is good. Be generous in your judgements. You will have to work harder than ever, but at different things. You will have dreams, and like all dreams, they will rarely come true. But in the evening of life you will realize that the dreams of youth were the props that held you steady through the joys and disappointments that we must all encounter in the experience of living, and the greatest experience in the world is EXPERIENCE.

RICH IN TRADITIONS

"As you now go forth to meet life you are following paths already made bright by the high attainments of former students from our two institutions of higher education. The college which you are now leaving is rich in the traditions of learning and is honored by the achievements of its many distinguished Alumni.

"You have been fortunate in the

excellence of the teachers who have guided you during the years spent within these walls. Especially I would pay tribute to your Principal, Dr. Frank MacKinnon who has so earnestly and successfully applied himself to the instruction and guidance of students in the formal lecture room; who has, by precept and example shown the great benefits education can be to community life when properly adapted; and who has, while still a young man brought honour and fame to his province, to his family and to himself.

"And here I think it is fitting to pay a special tribute to all the teachers of our schools and colleges who are devoting their talents and their lives to the noble duty of preparing our young people for the future - training them in those qualities necessary to make their lives useful and full.

"The teacher is a part of the student's life. He or she is teacher companion, example, a mold of character, the sculptor of tomorrow's citizens.

"And back of these is the home and family; the love, respect, companionship, the sharing of those priceless years in the family circle.

"This was the beginning of your education.

"Then the Church - We are a Christian country and our motives and actions should be based on Christian principles. A very important part of our education.

"Home, Church, School; the three sources of our growth and development.

In your garden of memories keep with you always the sweet thoughts of these and you will have your roses in December all through your lives.

ASK FOR HIGHER Pension Rates

MONTREAL (CP) - Quebec command of the Canadian Legion Wednesday asked the federal government to increase pensions to disabled war veterans by 33 1/3 per cent and raise the ceilings of permissible outside income for recipients of war veterans allowances.

The government has moved to increase the pension rates 20 per cent and the WVA ceilings to \$80 a month from \$70 for single veterans and to \$135 a month from \$120 for married veterans.

A resolution, adopted at the closing session of the provincial command's annual meeting, said the government increases are insufficient.

Another motion asked the government to ensure that veterans in the civil service be given preference in promotions where other qualifications for the job are equal.

ISRAELI VOLUNTEERS

HAIFA, Israel (Reuters) - The Israeli Seamen's union is being flooded with enough applications to man an entire convoy from Israel sea men volunteering to serve on an Israeli "test ship" through the Suez canal. Authorities have not yet decided on the date of the sailing.
