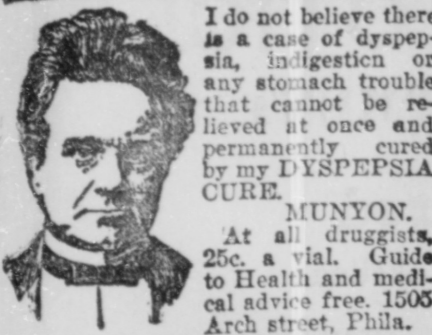

Local and Other Items.

OTTAWA'S POPULATION—Ottawa's population is now 57,700, an increase of over 1,600 in the year.

FORGED NOTES—The Dominion police believe that they are on the track of the men who have so successfully forged and passed off the Dominion one-dollar notes, with which the country has been flooded.

THE IDEA APPROVED—The Montreal Star has interviewed a large number of Montreal citizens on the advisability of sending a Canadian regiment to aid Great Britain in the event of war in the Transvaal, and nice out of every ten approved of the idea.

RAILWAY TIME TABLE—There will be several important changes made in the running arrangement of trains on the Island railway beginning with Monday next. No 1 express for Summerside leaves Charlottetown at 6:30 a. m., arriving at Summerside at 8:45, connecting there with steamer for Point Du Chene. An accommodation train will leave Charlottetown at 5 p. m for Cape Traverse and intermediate stations, arriving at Cape Traverse at 9:35 p. m. The first train in the morning will leave Summerside at 6:40 a. m., and will arrive here at 9:40 a. m. The train from Tignish will leave at 5 a. m, connecting with steamer at Summerside and arriving at Charlottetown at 1 p. m. Another train will leave Tignish at 1:12 p. m connecting at Summerside with steamer from Point du Chene and arriving at Charlottetown at 10:15 p. m. The train leaving Souris at 6 a. m, and Georgetown at 6:45 a. m, will arrive at Charlottetown at 9 a. m. The trains leaving Souris at 11:35 a. m, and Georgetown at 12:30 p. m, will arrive at Charlottetown at 3:50 p. m, connecting at Royalty Junction with the train leaving Charlottetown at 3:10 for Summerside. This latter train runs on the same schedule as during the summer season. The express train leaves Charlottetown at 7 a. m, and will arrive at Souris at 10 a. m, and Georgetown at 9:10 a. m. The afternoon train leaving Charlottetown at 2 p. m, arrives at Souris at 6:05 p. m and at Georgetown at 5 p. m. The above hours are all standard time.
