Sir,—What can be the matter with the Patriot? As a true Liberal, I have always looked to the organ of our party for a fair and truthful account of any interesting incident or event.

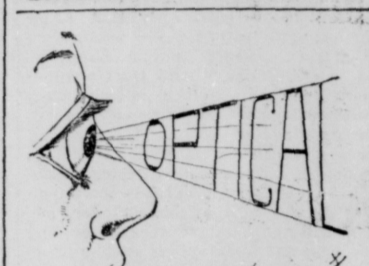
SOCIAL AND ENTERTAINMENT.

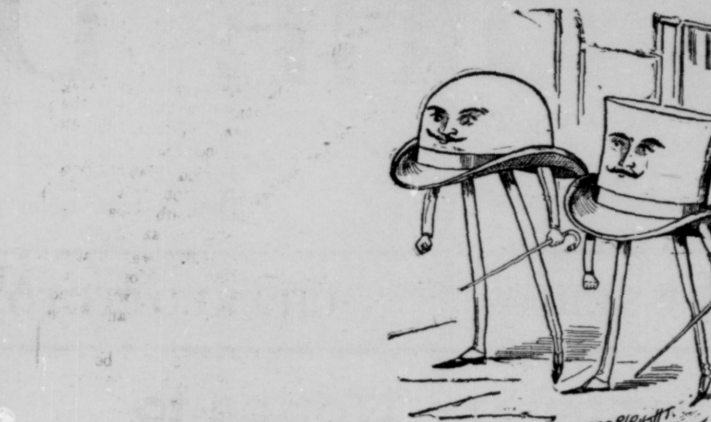
