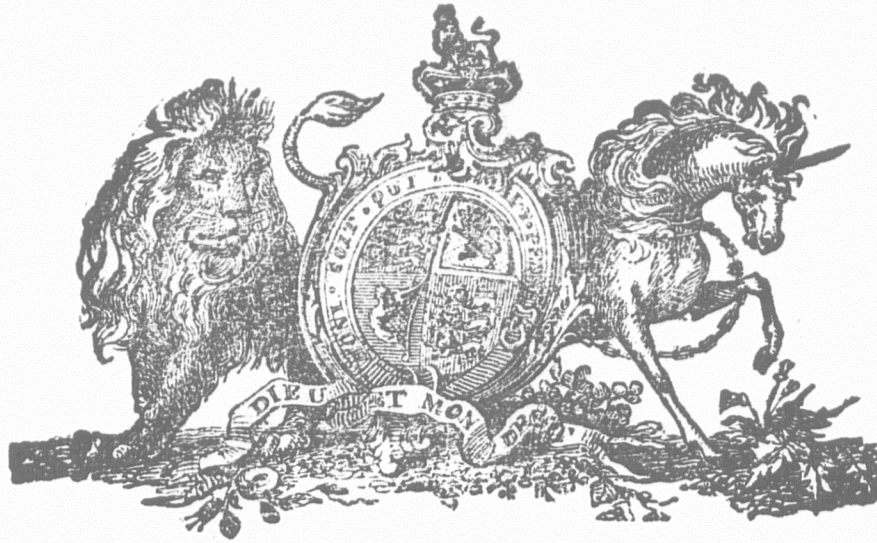

WHEREAS the General Assembly of this Island stands prorogued until Thursday, the Eighteenth day of February, instant:
